FAITH AND HEARING

"Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" (Rom. 10:17).

This important passage of Scripture is, sad to say, little understood. Many people think of faith in the abstract, as though it were some mysterious power in itself. They speak of faith, but what do they mean? Faith in what? or in whom? Surely it is not possible just to have faith, without something or someone to have faith in.

Faith is not wishing hard, or feeling confident. Much less is it optimism or presumption or imagination. Faith must have a basis, a foundation. Thus the Christian's faith is founded on "the Word of God" - on what God has said in the Bible. The above passage explains: "Faith cometh by hearing." Isn't that simple? Isn't it true? Some have said that "seeing is believing," but a moment's reflection will reveal that, like the phrase: "I'm from Missouri," this saying is an expression of Unbelief.

All true Christian faith is founded on the Word of God.

Actually the word "hearing", in Rom. 10:17, has the idea of heeding -- paying attention, eager listening. This is why Gal. 3:5 speaks of "the hearing of faith." Thus Eph. 1:13, referring to Christ, says: "IN WHOM YE ALSO TRUSTED, HAVING HEARD THE WORD OF TRUTH, THE GOSPEL OF YOUR SALVATION." Similarly we read in John 5:24 the words of the Lord Jesus: "HE THAT HEARETH MY WORD, AND BELIEVETH ON HIM THAT SENT ME, HATH EVERLASTING LIFE, AND SHALL NOT COME INTO JUDGEMENT, BUT IS PASSED FROM DEATH UNTO LIFE."

LAWRENCEVILLE, Va. -- For Seniors and Honors Day at Saint Paul's College on Friday, May 6th, at 10:30 a. m., when 27 awards, cash prizes, and scholarships will be awarded outstanding members of the graduating and lower classes, the speaker will be the president of North Carolina A&T College at Greensboro, Dr. Lewis C. Dowdy. The annual program will be in Kirby Auditorium of the Chicago Building at 10:30 a. m.

Dr. Dowdy, a native of Eastover, S. C., has had a rich experience in education. He holds the A. B. Degree from Allen University, the M. A. Degree from Indiana State University, Ed. D. Degree from Indiana University, and the honorary degree of Litt. D. from Allen.

He served eight years as a school principal in South Carolina before going to A&T College as instructor of education and director of student teaching in 1951. Later he was elected dean of the School of Education and General Studies and subsequently was named dean of instruction. For a time he served as acting president, being elected to head the college in April, 1964.


Make a Wish...


The formal installation service will climax activities which began on April 17, at 7:30 p. m. with a lay sermon by Roy G. Trice, acting chairman of the Board of
