Six At NCC Recive Rockefeller Awards

DURHAM -- Six North Carolina College seniors have been awarded Rockefeller Foundation Post-Accelaureate Fellowships for high ability students whose earlier education may have been inadequate in some respects.

Selected for the program, which is primarily designed for those who wish to continue their education through the doctoral level, were Norma Sutton of Winston-Salem; Richard Cagle of Pinehurst; Madge Leach of Asheville; Clifton Woods of Charlotte; and Zelton Johnson of Henderson.

The program, under a \$450,000 grant from the Rockefeller Foundation, will underwrite the cost of the students' education at one of seven select liberal arts colleges for

two semesters and one summer of special study to complement the regular program.

The six NCC students were among 33 successful applicants for the fellowships from 150 different colleges. They will take regular college courses, including seminars, and where appropriate, project or research courses. There is no set curriculum. The courses will be tailored to the needs of the individual.

"Thus," said Dr. William Cadbury, who resigned as dean of Haverford College to become director of the program, "we will attempt to fill gaps in preparation and extend such training as necessary to help ensure success in future university study."

Says Race Fraternal Groups Are Becoming More Militant

DETROIT, Mich. - William V. Banks, Detroit fraternal leader, said last week that Negro fraternal organizations are becoming more militant in seeking full social, economic and political equality for all people.

He said the IBOPE, EIKS, through their civil liberties program spearheaded by Judge Hobson Reynolds, Grand Exalted Ruler, and the Grand Lodges of the International Masons group are examples of the new action Negro fraternalism in America has taken to help improve the status of our people.

Atty. Banks said when the Grand Lodge of Texas met at Texarkana last weekend, the Lodge & Eastern Star Chapter under the leadership of C. Hall, grand master and Mrs. Bernice McQueen of Dgts., passed a resolution asking the governor and members of the school boards in six Texas communities to provide full kindergarten to all children regardless of race.

"When the North Carolina Grand Lodge met at Redsville, May 7, 8, they demanded that city services such as street paving, cleaning, drainage, sewerage, and garbage disposal be equalized in Negro neighborhoods in all North Carolina cities."

"With the Negro registering and voting in the south we can expect a change in the attitudes of white politicians, Wm. Banks

added. The North Carolina Grand Lodge is headed by James C. Barry, Grand Master, of Greenville, N. C. and Mrs. Nellie Butler, Grand Matron, of Reidsville.

Roger Wilkins Notes Women's Role At Meet

CHARLESTON, W. Va. (UPI) - Roger W. Wilkins, nephew of NAACP executive director Roy Wilkins, and recently appointed director Community Relations Service, U. S. Department of Justice, last week pinpointed the role of women as an educational force.

Speaking at the luncheon session of the midwest regional conference of Delta Sigma Theta sorority, he charged the inter-racial public service organization with the responsibility of promoting voter registration, increasing educational quality and equality, and improving the status of the American family.

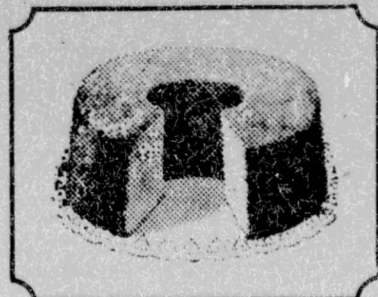
