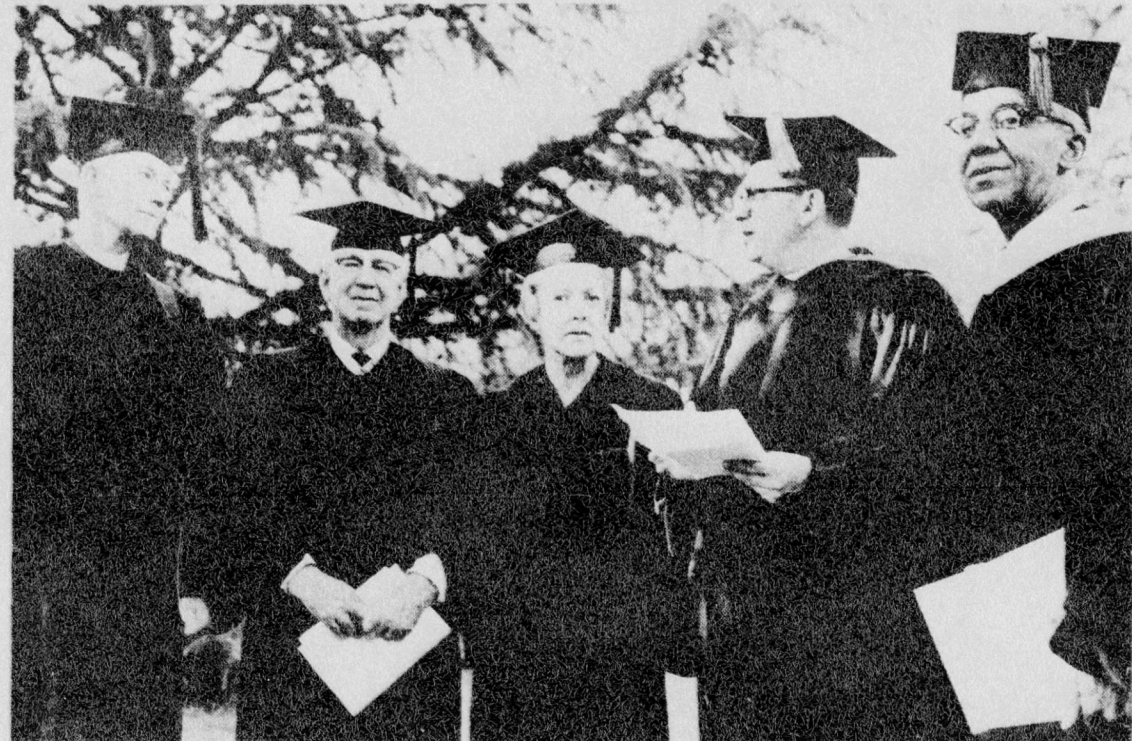

DURHAM - Dr. Ezra L. Totton, chairman of the Department of Chemistry at North Carolina College, reports that of 12 1966 B. S. degree recipients in chemistry, five have accepted positions in industry with an average salary of \$7,500 per year.

**Problems Beyond Law, More Difficult, 160 J. C. Smith U. Grads Are Told**

CHARLOTTE -- Johnson C. Smith University graduates were told last week that the problems outside law will be greater and harder to solve. Ramon S. Scruggs, public relations manager of American Telephone and Telegraph Company, delivering the Commencement address said "Strictly speaking, the civil rights struggle, which means the struggle for legal rights, has nearly been won. Now the struggle for human rights, for equality of opportunity in such areas as education, jobs, housing, and health and welfare must be won before Negro citizen is to live in America on a par

with his white counterpart. The social and economic problems that affect Negroes, it seems, are less amenable to change than the enactment of law, as difficult as that has been." Mr. Scruggs bemoaned the school drop-out youngsters. He stated that "Too often, Negro young people have been counseled not to have high hopes, not to dream. In too many instances they have been imbued with the futility of trying. This has to change, and the place to begin it is in the public schools."

Urging the 160 graduates to pay the price for greatness, Mr. Scruggs warned: You must be a good American citizen and you must stand for those principles and programs and policies which are for the betterment and strengthening of your neighborhood, your city, your state and your nation. There will be times too when you must put the general welfare before the narrower group welfare."
