EXPENSIVE TOOLS STOLEN

YOUNGSTER ROBS STORE

Mrs. Marlon Senoria Costin, who sometimes works at the Restful Pines Broadview Grocery, 719 E. Lenoir St., told "the law" at 9:05 p. m. Wednesday, that a colored male, unknown to her, came into the store about 8:30 p. m. and bought a Coke, drank it there, and asked her several general questions, including "if business was good and if I had a telephone in the store."

Mrs. Costin said he left at this time, but returned about 8:50 p. m., and told her to give him all the money in the cash register.

The woman said he had a paper bag and claimed he had a gun, "so get it all," he said. Then he suddenly told her he was in a hurry, "so leave the change where it is." In the store with her at the time was her 6-year-old niece. She described the robber as being about 20 years old, six feet tall, of medium build and complexion, and had gold trim about his two front teeth at the top. The woman said she would know him if she ever sees him again. The thief-robber got away with \$25.

Owner of the store, "Big" Henry Otis Scott, said someone came to his residence, 601 Church Street, and told him his store had been robbed. Scott then came to his store and, from the description, was not able to figure out who the culprit could be. The cops however, have at least two leads, which they are now checking out.

WOULD-BE THIEF THWARTED
