Substitute Mail Handler Posts Open In Raleigh

The Postal Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners, Greensboro, has announced that applications will be accepted

the Raleigh Post Office. Starting salary is \$2.37 per hour. Mail Handlers load, unload, and move bulk mail, and per-

mail. Duties may include separating of mail for delivery to conveying units or to distribution points; inspecting, arranging, and labeling empty

sacks, facing letter mail; canceling stamps or parcel post: operating canceling machine, rewrapping parcels, etc.

The minimum age limit for these positions is 18; however, this age limit is waived for high school graduates. They may be appointed when they reach their 16th birthday.

Applicants must actually reside within the delivery area of the Raleigh Post Office or be a bona fide patron of the office.

Applicants will be required to take a written test and all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment according to rating achieved, without regards to creed, sex, color or national origin

Applicants will be accepted until further notice.


