GREENSBORO - The Redevelopment Program of this city was enhanced on Sept. 18 when the new quarter of a million dollar edifice, which will house the congregation of Trinity AME Zion Church, was dedicated.

The occasion drew a record crowd. Biship R. L. Jones, who presides over the area, delivered the dedicatory sermon and also led the congregation in the Act of Dedication. The interest manifested by members of both races again proved the value of the Church to a community.


