Bennett Trustees Approved Budget Of \$1,544,000

GREENSBORO - Bennett College trustees, in annual session Saturday, approved a budget of \$1,544,000 for 1966-67, an increase of \$40,000 over the previous budget.

The board also gave authorization to proceed with the construction of a \$1,200,000 science building, bids for which are scheduled to be opened on Oct. 27.

Announcement of a grant of \$300,000 toward the cost of this building was made by Miss Dorothy McConnell, of New York City, associate general secretary of the Woman's Division of the National Board of Missions of the Methodist Church, who was attending her first board meeting.

President Isaac H. Miller, Jr., stated that the grant, together with other funds committed, will be sufficient to round out the money needed for the building. In his report to the board, Dr. Miller called attention to the increased demands upon the college and said:

"I submit that at Bennett we have the will and the know-how, the faculty and the students to stand tall in higher education. It is our commitment to build solidly in all academic areas and to maintain proper balance in our total effort."

The trustees heard reports from the investment, finance and building committees and learned that the college has 645 students, 15 from other countries. Several of them remained for the Founders' Day program at 11 a. m. Sunday.
