Gift bags, which should be approximately 12" X 13" with drawing top, should contain no liquids, combustibles, food, or any item that would melt or deteriorate in heat or under pressure.

Dr. Brown, professor of surgery at Meharry Medical School, and also a Bennett trustee, spoke on "Negro Women in an Era of Revolt."

"New opportunities for women today," she said, "put them in a position of leadership in their communities. They have an academic edge and as mothers can do much in the preparation of their children for life."

Nov. 1, 1917--The Julius Rosenthal Fund for educational, scientific and cultural purposes organized.

Nov. 1, 1943--Dr. Charles W. Buggs, first Negro appointed to Wayne University College of Medicine faculty in Detroit.

Nov. 2, 1939--Maj. John R. Lynch, who served three terms in the U.S. Congress, died.

Nov. 3, 1794--William Cullen Bryant, a poet of freedom, born.

Nov. 4, 1829--American Convention of Abolition Societies organized in Washington, D.C.

Nov. 4, 1865--Wendell Phillips Dabney, now deceased (June 3, 1952), was born in Richmond, Va. Known as the "Grand Old Man of Journalism," he was editor-publisher of the Union, a weekly newspaper in Cincinnati.

Nov. 4, 1902--Birth of Langston Hughes, famous writer-poet-lecturer, in Joplin, Mo.

Nov. 5, 1873--Maj. John R. Lynch, Congressman from Mississippi, was elected to his first term in the U.S. Congress.

Nov. 5, 1906--Dr. John Hope appointed the first Negro president of Morehouse college.

THE VETERANS' CORNER

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q--Can I use one certification card to show attendance in school under the new G.I. Bill for a period June 20 through August 14, 1966?

A--One certification card can cover the full period when training is interrupted or completed. Otherwise, a card must be completed and submitted for each month of training.

Q--Under the new G.I. Bill, when will a veteran certify his monthly attendance?

A--Veterans enrolled in institutions of higher learning will not certify their first month's attendance. They will receive a certification card with their first month's check, and then must report and certify attendance for each month thereafter. Veterans enrolled in insti-
