Services Are Held For Mrs. B. O. Davis, Sr.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Funeral services have been held for Mrs. Davis, 86, wife of retired Army Brig. Gen. Benjamin O. Davis, Sr.

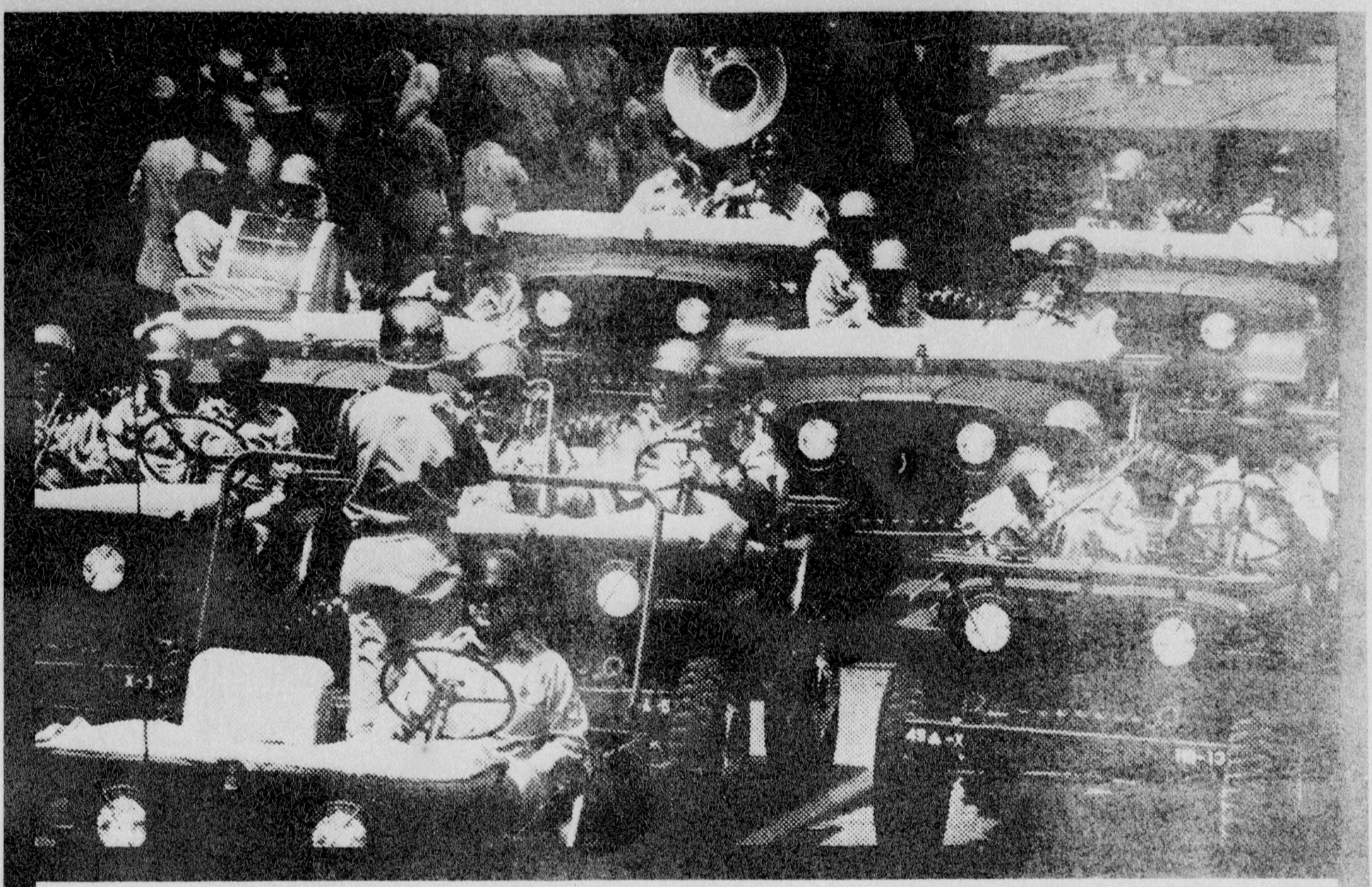
A native of Macon, Ga., Mrs. Davis died following complications from a heart attack. She had entered Walter Reed General Army Hospital, Aug. 19. She had reportedly suffered an earlier heart attack five years ago, from which an acute condition developed, resulting in an appendectomy.

Mrs. Davis taught English at Clark College, Atlanta, and Wilberforce University. She received a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Chicago and a master of arts degree from Ohio State University.

Her son, Lt. Benjamin O. Davis, Jr., serves as chief of staff of United States forces and the United Nations command in Korea. Gen. Davis, Sr., and his son are the first two Negro generals in the U. S. history.

Mrs. Davis was the mother-in-law of Illinois State Rep. James McClendon.
