ECSC To Observe 75 Years Of Progress

Featuring a series of programs open to the public, Elizabeth City State College will observe its 75th anniversary as a growing educational institution, on Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 10 and 11. The Eastern North Carolina College was founded in 1891 as the result of a bill introduced in the N. C. Legislature by Hugh Cole, Negro member, elected from Elizabeth City.

A notable event of the occasion will be the 75th anniversary convocation, preceded by faculty members in formal academic procession, Sunday, 3:30 p. m., in Williams Hall. Clarence Mitchell, Director Washington, D. C. Bureau of the NAACP, will deliver the main address. Dr. Walter N. Ridley, President of the College, will award citations to several alumni and citizens during the service.

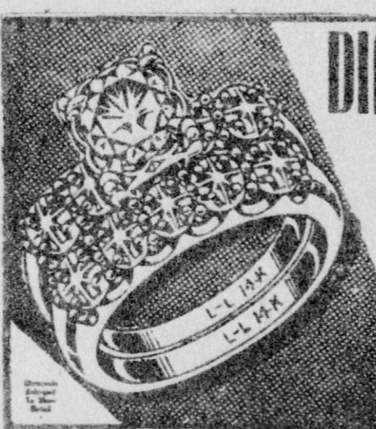

Agers was among some 78 volunteers who traveled by chartered flight to the West African nation together with Jack Vaughn, director of the Peace Corps.

This new group of volunteers were trained last summer for three months at the University of California at San Diego, where they studied three Nigerian languages, its culture and history, world affairs and American history.

Upon arrival in Nigeria's capital of Lagos, the Corpsmen underwent three days of additional orientation before going to their station in three southern provinces of the country.
