study program consisted primar-

Negro and White Southern Col-
leges. This program enabled

American intellectual history
and international political
affairs.

Brenda is enthusiastic about
her experiences at Yale for the
intellectual attainments and for
the social life which was
integrated with other programs.
The program also helped her
gain insight into what is ex-
pected of her upon entering
graduate school. Commenting
on the program, Miss Dowery
said, "The program at Yale
gave me some insight into my
deficiencies and what I should
do to overcome them. The
experience gave me great acade-
mic motivation.

Brenda has considered
several schools for further stu-
dy; among them, Yale, Prince-
ton, and Duke's Law School. She
hopes to enter the Foreign
Service after graduate school
or law school.

Miss Dowery has been an
outstanding student on campus
since entering the college in
1963. She is a member of

Social Science Honor Society.
Brenda has worked on "The
Penny" staff since her fresh-
man year and last year was
elected editor-in-chief of the
campus newspaper. She is a
member of the tutorial program

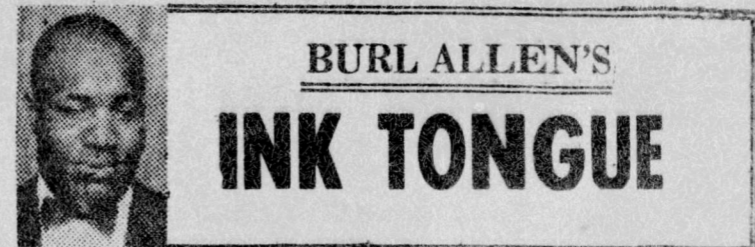
