WASHINGTON -- Secretary of Labor Willard Wirtz has taken three steps to protect young people against hazardous employment and to increase job opportunities for them.

The actions include: --In response to 1966 a-mendments to the Fair Labor Standards Act, identification of those occupations which are particularly hazardous to youth working in agriculture. This interim order will become effective on January 1, 1968.

--Certain modifications in Hazardous Occupations Orders Number 2 and 7 concerning helpers on motor vehicles, motor vehicle drivers and elevator operators. These changes will become effective immediately.

--Revision of Child Labor Regulation No. 3 to allow 14and 15 year-olds to work until 9 p.m. between next June 1 and Labor Day. The previous time limit for these young workers was 7 p.m.


