### Wirtz Moves To Improve Conditions

WASHINGTON -- Secretary of Labor Willard Wirtz has taken three steps to protect young people against hazardous employment and to increase job opportunities for them.

The actions include:

- In response to 1966 amendments to the Fair Labor Standards Act, identification of those occupations which are particularly hazardous to youth working in agriculture. This interim order will become effective on January 1, 1968.
- Certain modifications in Hazardous Occupations Orders Number 2 and 7 concerning helpers on motor vehicles, motor vehicle drivers and elevator operators. These changes will become effective immediately.
- Revision of Child Labor Regulation No. 3 to allow 14- and 15 year-olds to work until 9 p.m. between next June 1 and Labor Day. The previous time limit for these young workers was 7 p.m.
- In addition, youth between 14 and 16 will be allowed to participate in work-training programs during school hours under certain conditions consistent with the benefits of the Economic Opportunity Act.
- Mr. Wirtz said these changes are being made as a part of a continuous review program designed to insure that the orders reflect changing conditions and new legislations.
