## Oscar Smith New PR Man At Shaw U.

Dr. James E. Cheek, president of Shaw University, recently announced the appointment of Oscar S. Smith, Jr. as director of Public Relations.

The 38-year-old Raleigh native returns to the area after a 10-year stint in the Washington, D. C. area and a 5-years stay in Prince George's County, Maryland.

He has held professional positions as a radio - news announcer with now non-operative WRNC - FM District Heights, Maryland, ten years with the United States Information Agency as an information specialist, a year as director of community relations with the City of Glenarden, Md., and four years as executive direc-

tor of the Glenarden Urban Renewal Agency.

While in Maryland, he was appointed by the Prince George's County Commissioners to the County Improvement Committee, and the County Cultural Commission. He also served as a consultant to the County Human Relations Commission.

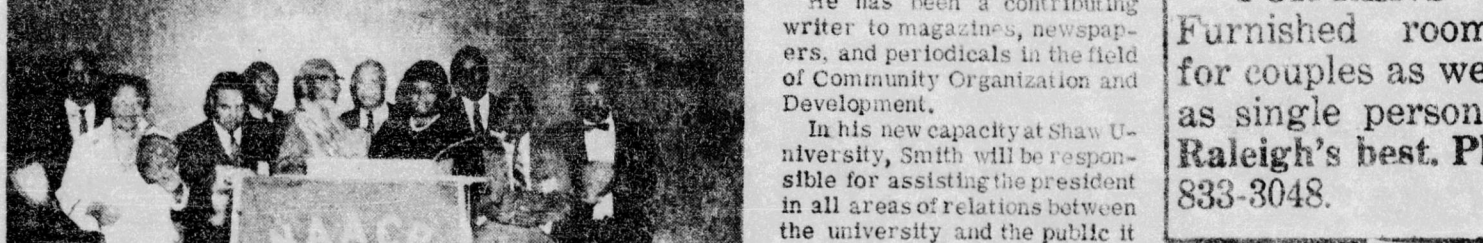
