Wife Not Tax Dependent Says IRS

GREENSBORO - So far as the Internal Revenue Service is concerned, your wife is never your dependent (and vice versa) when you file your Federal income tax return.

And what does this mean? "Simply this," says J. E. Wall, IRS District Director, "If your spouse has any amount of taxable income, the spouse may not be claimed as an exemption on your return unless the total amount of income of each spouse is listed on the return and both husband and wife sign the form making it a joint return."

Wall says that many taxpayers err by claiming a spouse as a dependent when the spouse has less than \$600 income. The spouse with the smaller income then attempts to file a separate return for the purpose of getting a refund, but this isn't proper.

"If a dependent child has income," Wall said, "the child must file return to get his refund and his parent may still claim his dependency credit. This doesn't hold true in the case of husband and wives. If they both have income they must file a joint return and list their combined incomes, if they wish to claim both exemption credits on the same return."
