payers err by claiming a spouse

as a dependent when the spouse

has less than \$600 income. The

spouse with the smaller income

then attempts to file a separate

return for the purpose of getting

a refund, but this isn't proper.

"If a dependent child has in-come," Wall said, "the child

must file return to get his re-

fund and his parent may still

claim his dependency credit.
