Chief Support Not Always A Must For Dependency Credit

GREENSBORO-it is not always necessary for a taxpayer to furnish chief support to a person in order to be eligible to list that person as a dependent on his Federal income tax return, according to J. E. Wall, IRS District Director.

A good example of this is found in the case where several children contribute, together, the total support of their parent. Although not one of them contributes the parent's chief support, those who contribute more than 10% of the support may decide, among themselves, who shall claim the parent as a dependent.

The others then sign agreement forms (2120) which are attached to the return of the one claiming the parent, and the dependent automatically becomes allowable under the "multiple

support" provision of the Regulations.

Prior to the multiple support provision, no taxpayers was allowed to list a person as a dependent unless he furnished more than half the total support of the dependent during the year.

Danforth Fellowship Scarborough Gets A

Danny L. Scarborough, son of Mrs. Bertha Lewis, Wake Forest, has won a Danforth Graduate Fellowship for advanced study for the Ph.D. degree, according to a recent announcement from the Danforth Foundation of St. Louis, Missouri. The Fellowship provides tuition and living expenses for four years of study in preparation for a career of college teaching. Scarborough was nominated for this fellowship by Saint Augustine's College, where he is a senior.

More than 1,900 college seniors from colleges and universities throughout the United States competed for the 113 Fellowships awarded this year.

The Danforth Fellowship are designed to encourage outstanding College Graduates who show promise for distinguished careers in college teaching in order to help meet the critical need for such people.

Selection of Danforth Fellows is made annually by a national panel of educators, primarily on the basis of the evident intellectual power of the candidate, and his commitment to humane values and their place in higher education.

Over 1,500 Danforth Fellow-

ship have been awarded since the program was established in 1952, and more than 700 of these men and women have finished Ph.D. degrees and are now teaching in college and universities.
