> PREGNANCY PLANNING AND HEALTH

Dear Mrs. Riggsbee:

I have been following your column for several months because I'm thinking about using the birth control pills, and I want to know as much about them Dear Mrs. T. P .:

There are several of what might be called "good" sideeffects from the pills, and it I haven't yet mentioned them in my column, I'm glad your let-

ter gives me the opportunity. When you are taking the pills your period will be regular and nearly predictable to the day. Even if you have always been irregular, you can expect your period about every 28 days when you take the pills. In most cases the pills also help to lessen that period of tension many women experience just before a period. The pills should help to lessen menstrual cramps, and you can expect to have a lighter flow.

Dear Mrs. Riggsbee:

My sister-in-law, just had her first baby two weeks ago. Her husband is very happy about baby, but he's getting pretty itchy about his sex life, if you know what I mean. You know how it is with these men, Mrs. Riggsbee. Since he couldn't have sex with my sister-in-law during the last few weeks, of her pregnancy, he is getting mighty

It's driving her so nuts that she's about to give in and try to have sex with him just to keep him quiet!

I have told her she should wait a few weeks longer. At least this is what my doctor told me when I had my babies. But she doesn't believe me. I know she reads your column in THE CAROLINIAN, so maybe you could say a few words about this for her own good. Mrs. L. T. Dear Mrs. L. T.:

Your sister-in-law should talk to her doctor about this. As a general rule, however, since the first baby usually requires stitches for the mother, it may not be wise for them to resume sex relations until she is completely healed,

The reason for this is to avoid possible infection. Most doctors tell their patients to wait about six weeks before having sex after a baby is de-Hevered, but some couples do not wait that long. It depends partly on how a couple feels. and most importantly, on what the doctor advises. I'm sure her husband would be glad to wait a little longer if he understood that it was doctor's orders.
