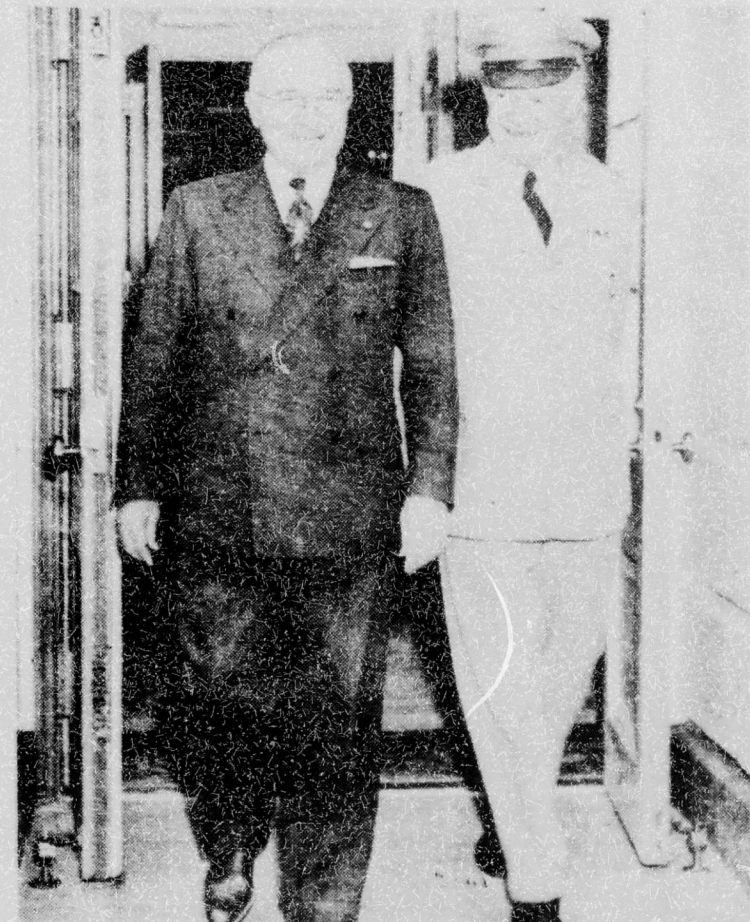




IN THE BIOLOGY LABORATORY, Dr. Dill instructor, is shown working with Morris Brown, student at Delaware State College in Dover.

Delaware State Is A College Of Distinction, Quality Education

DOVER, Del. - Delaware State College is a college of distinction and offers a quality education. The college is large enough to serve you, and small enough to know you.

A Liberal Arts College, chartered by the State of Delaware and the Middle State Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, Delaware State College is located in the historic First State, three miles from the state capitol in Dover.

No individual desiring an education and desiring to enter Delaware State should allow the lack of finance to "turn him off" from continuing his education. The cost for a good Liberal Arts education for out of state boarding students is just over one thousand dollars. Financial assistance to help those students who, without this assistance, would be unable to continue their education is available. Work Study Grants, Educational Opportunity Grants, and National Defense Loans are available to qualifying students. Also, for financial assistance are special ability scholarships and grants, such as Athletics Work Aid, Music Scholarships, Track "A" Departmental Scholars, and Prestige Scholarships.

For students attending Delaware State College, the student activities are varied. Students are members of practically all College Committees. The Placement Office offers students and graduates assistance in obtaining employment. Through personal interviews and analysis of interests and experiences, the Placement office helps to guide students and graduates into occupations.

The new 30,000 square foot Student Center has a large gen-

eral lounge, recreational area, post office, bookstore, canteen, TV room, student government suite, student newspaper office, and honors general meeting rooms, and one thousand person capacity air conditioned "multi-purpose room" which can be used as an auditorium.

A new men's dormitory has just been completed and is occupied. Another new women's dormitory will be completed by spring 1970.

To be completed by 1970 is a five million dollar Humanities and Teacher Education Complex. This building will accommodate the school's Teacher Education program, departments of fine arts, music, languages, literature, philosophy, and drama.

The academic program has experimental programs such as educational television and programmed instructions. A Computer Center is becoming a pivotal point in the educational development. An extensive program in astronomy is offered.

The Chemistry Department of Delaware State College has been cited for being one of the 62 outstanding student affiliate chapters by the Council Committee on Chemical Education.

A College Writing Lab was initiated this year. The program is not a substitute for the regular English Courses but is to aid in resolving a student's writing problems.

A three day Writer's Lab Conference is held in the Spring. This conference brings outstanding professional and aspiring writers together. The writers discuss their relevance to the struggle for the liberation of man and their vision for America and the world.

Early in the year, students interested in Creative Writing are asked to submit manuscripts at the Conference.

A new Home Economics-Business Administration Complex features separate facilities for the two fields of study under one roof. In the home economics structure is included home management laboratory suite, laboratories and classroom for foods, food trades, textiles, and clothing courses, as well as laboratories and workshops for child care and development.

The business administration and business education departments are becoming the largest departments. Because of change in personnel thinking of industry, Delaware State College's business students are in demand.

A new curriculum in Business Education, Distributive Education, was offered this year. This is designed to prepare persons with the necessary technical and professional training. The curriculum will enable a person to teach, coordinate, or initiate distributive educational programs in public schools, junior colleges, vocational technical institutions, and educational agencies. New Black Courses have been offered in the department of English and Political Science.

WASHINGTON - Sen. John Tower (GOP, Texas) has called upon the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to adopt a new policy on school desegregation which

In his weekly radio broadcast, the senator declared, "I am convinced a freedom of choice school desegregation plan which is sincerely applied, is the best manner in which to provide equal education of high quality for all our children."

PROJECT LIBRARY
CHICAGO - A reading and study center has been established in the Harold Ickes low-rent housing project of the Chicago Housing Authority by the Chicago public library. The first such center to be opened in a housing development, it is intended to give library

facilities to the tenants occupying the development. The library makes use of a five-room apartment in one of the project buildings.

DOUBLE ENROLLMENT
HARRISBURG, Pa. - Pennsylvania State University plans to launch a million-dollar program to more than double the number of Black students in the school. The plan would admit 500 "disadvantaged students" with \$1,500 in financial aid to each one. Penn State has about 300 Black students among the 25,000 at the University Park campus.

AN "NPI" FEATURE

April 1, 1854 - Augustus Tolton, of Quincy, Ill., became the first Negro to be ordained a priest in U. S.

April 2, 1867 - Howard University, Washington, D. C. chartered by an Act of Congress.

April 2, 1905 - Birth of Josephine Baker, actress-singer-dancer of international fame, in St. Louis. She now makes her home in France.

April 3, 1867 - E. H. Hale, anti-slavery author, born.

April 3, 1867 - James Walker became the first Negro to vote in the State of Nebraska, casting his ballot at a city charter election in Plattsmouth.

April 3, 1928 - Organization in Chicago of the National De Sable Memorial Society for the study of life and history of Jean Baptiste Point De Sable, explorer and first permanent settler of Chicago.

April 3, 1944 - U. S. Supreme court voids white primary laws.

April 4, 1792 - Thaddeus Stevens, reconstructionist, born.

April 4, 1822 - William Syphax, pioneer educator in the District of Columbia, born on George Washington's estate at Alexandria, Va.

April 4, 1892 - Birth of Eustace Gay, president and general manager, Philadelphia Tribune, in Barbados, West Indies.

April 4, 1968 - Death of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., at age 39, by an assassin's bullet on the veranda of the Lorraine motel, Memphis, Tenn.

April 5, 1770 - Crispus Attucks was the first American martyr in the fight for independence from British rule, during the Boston Commons massacre.

April 5, 1856 - Booker T. Washington, famous educator-founder of Tuskegee Institute (Ala.) was born a slave in Franklin County, Virginia.

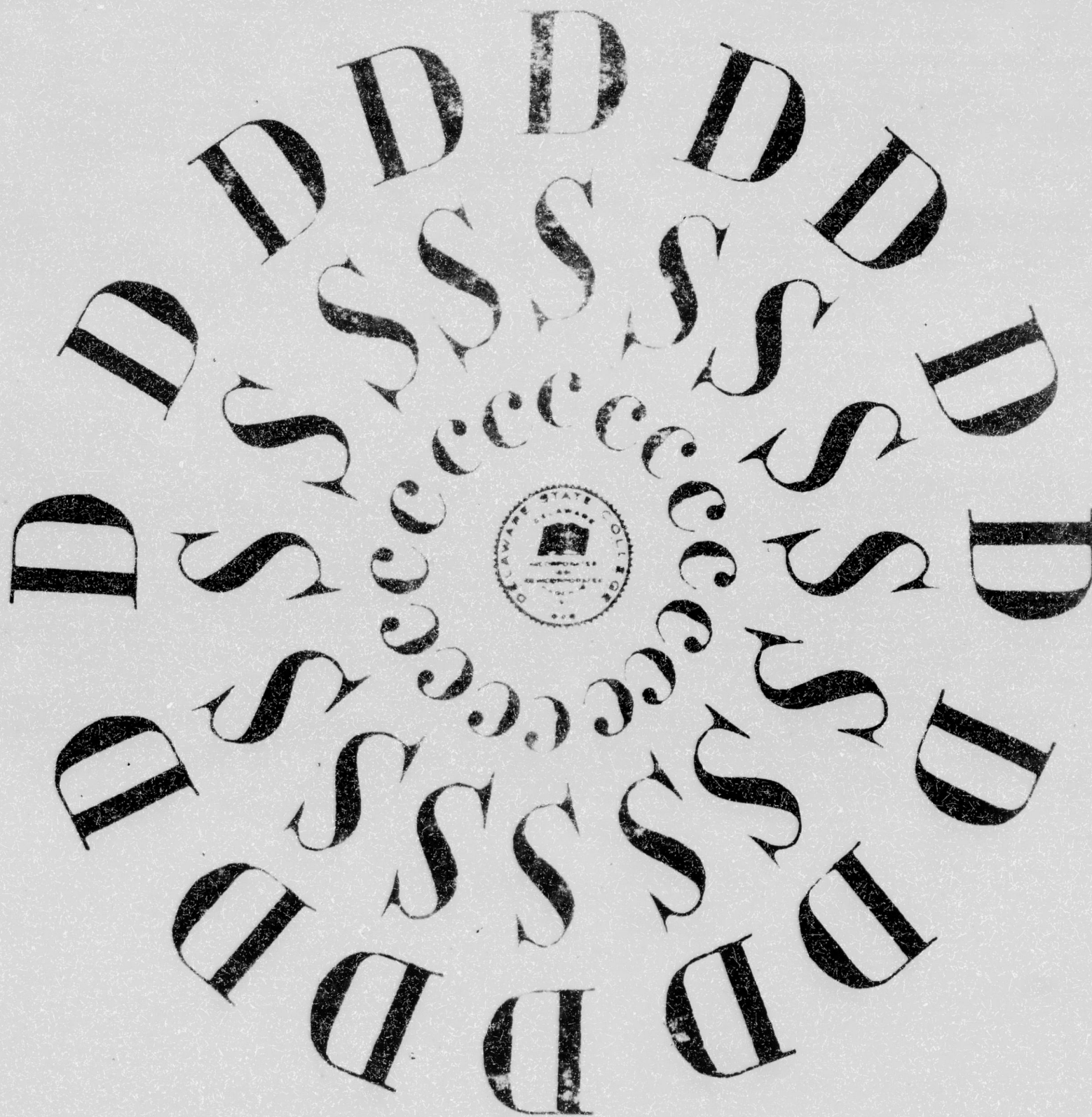
