American hostesses have learned their three "party-P's" well-they can always be counted upon to serve up bowls of pea-nuts, pretzels and potato chips, with a good assortment of dips. The reason so many people serve them is that so many nibblers love them. The potato chip, for instance, isn't called the Great American Snack for nothing!

However pleasant it is to merely offer "as is" yummies, it's even more fun to add a dash of creativity in the nibbles department. The rule of thumb for making hors d'oeuvres is: Make as many as you think are necessary -and then double the amount! If they're especially appetizing. guests always eat more than anticipated, and they'll disappear from the plate before you can say 'Seconds, anyone?"

An easy and interesting appetizer is French Fried Shrimp. The shrimps come all clean and packaged from the frezen foodscase; all you do is coat them with egg-and-flour batter, roll them in finely crushed Wise potato chips and fry in deep hot fat until golden brown.
