### Old North State Med Society Concerned Over NC House Bill

The Old North States Medical Society, at a recent executive board meeting adopted resolutions expressing the organization's concern about the bill recently introduced in the house by Representative Hugh Johnson and seven other sponsors. The bill would provide \$130,000,000 this year and \$325,000,000 next year to educate North Carolinians at Duke University and Bowman Gray medical schools.

The medical group supports the idea of aiding private medical schools in the state and assistance in the payment of student tuition provided that proper guidelines are established to assure that no racial discrimination is used in the distribution of the funds or in admission to the medical schools.

Dr. Hubert Eaton of Wilmington, was named chairman of a committee to contact the Legislature to ascertain this assurance.

### Convicted Slayers Of Malcolm X Lose Appeal

ALBANY, N. Y. - The conviction of three Black Muslims for slaying Malcolm X has been upheld by the state Court of Appeals.

The Black nationalist leader was slain while preparing to address some 400 followers in a Manhattan ballroom Feb. 21, 1965.

The court unanimously held that "The proof that the defendants participated in the assassination of Malcolm X is abundant."

The defendants, Thomas Hayter, Norman SX Butler, and Thomas Johnson, all of New York, had asked the reversal of the conviction because the public and the press were barred from the courtroom during the testimony of two witnesses.
