



AN "ACTIVIST" CHURCH LOS ANGELES - The Rev. Channing Emery Phillips, 41-year-old Congregational minster from Washington, D. C., who became the first Black American to be nominated for the U. S. Presidency, has called upon the church to drop its "pletism" cover for wickedness, and replace it with an "activist" role. Speaking at the Grant AME Church, pastored by the Rev. John Hurst Adams, Rev. Phillips declared, "The church must accept not only the institution of love, but seek that power to make it effective."

LAYMAN NAMED JURIST CHARLESTON, S. C. - The first Black man in modern times to be named an associate judge of the local municipal court, happen to be a Methodist layman and official. He is Richard E. Fields, a member of the United Methodist General Board of Christian Social Concerns. ORDINATION

NASSAU - Two young Black Bahamians were ordained last Sunday to the priesthood by the Rt. Rev. Bernard Markham, Lord Bishop of Nassau and the Bahamas. The members also pledged support to the general secretary, Dr. Joseph H. Yeakel, in his "continuing efforts to include Black leadership on the executive level as well as all other levels."

Presbyterians Plan 181st Gen. Assemby

SAN ANTONIO - Major decisions on issues facing one of the largest Protestant denominations in America will be made here next month at the 181st United Presbyterian General Assembly. The event is scheduled May 14-21 in the San Antonio Convention Center.

About 2,000 persons, cluding approximately 840 commissioners (voting delegates) are expected to attend. The Assembly will be preceded by a Conference on Evangelism May 13-14.

This will be the first time the General Assembly of the 3.2 million member United Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A. has met in San Antonio. The Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A. -- which merged in 1958 with the United Presby terian Church of North America to form the present denomination-held its 1917 Assembly in Dallas.


