JEFFERSON CITY, Mo.-(NPI)-A record 657 cases of discrimination were received by the Missouri Commission on Human Rights, during the year 1968. There were 115 public accommodation complaints, all except one of which were based on race; three fourths of all employment complaints were based on race, and the number of complaints in this category rose by 51 over that of 1967.
