WHAT IS PRONUNCIATION?

QUESTION: I realize the importance of good pronunciation, it appears that the diacritical marking system is too complex. Explain please, --Mrs. V. L.

ANSWER: The dictionary diacritical marks are indispensable to every calling and to every period of life. If one does not know the meaning of these marks, he is handicapped in pronouncing words for himself. In life a knowledge of the diacritical marks is just as important as knowing the multiplication tables and spelling words.

The pronunciation of any word with more than one syllable may involve: (1) accuracy of speech sounds, (2) uttering sounds of a word in proper order, (3) dividing words into syllables, (4) using the customary accent of each syllable, and (5) normal inflectional pattern of the voice.
