100 Teenagers Selected For Delta Tours Of Nation

ST. LOUIS, Mo. - One hundred St. Louis area teenagers -- 50 on scholarships -- will visit national cultural and industrial centers this summer on tours sponsored by the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority.

The group is a racially and economically mixed group of youngsters participating in this year's Delta Teen-Lift, said Mrs. Frankie M. Freeman, national president of the public service sorority. The students will take one of three tours based on their vocational interest -- arts and humanities, government and international affairs, business and industry.

A new feature of the 1969 Teen-Lift is three days of sensitivity training, conducted by Dr. Jeanne L. Noble of New York University. The object of the training is to develop increased self-awareness, and receptivity to ideas and feelings of others.

"This training experience is particularly important this year because our group is racially mixed," Mrs. Freeman said. "It is a fact that little opportunity is provided people of different backgrounds to get to know each other -- we believe that this experience can have significant results," Mrs. Freeman said "not only for the young people, but for the future."

Parents will be invited to join their children for a half day of training. There will be follow-up sensitivity experience for both young people and parents when the tour is over.

Upon completion of the workshop the groups will begin their respective tours across country. The arts and humanities tour will include a visit to the home of architect Frank Lloyd Wright in Chicago and New York's Lincoln Center. Those interested in government and international affairs
