Following the wedding a reception was held in the church. The bride is the former Miss Hunt, a teacher at the Shepard School, Zebulon.

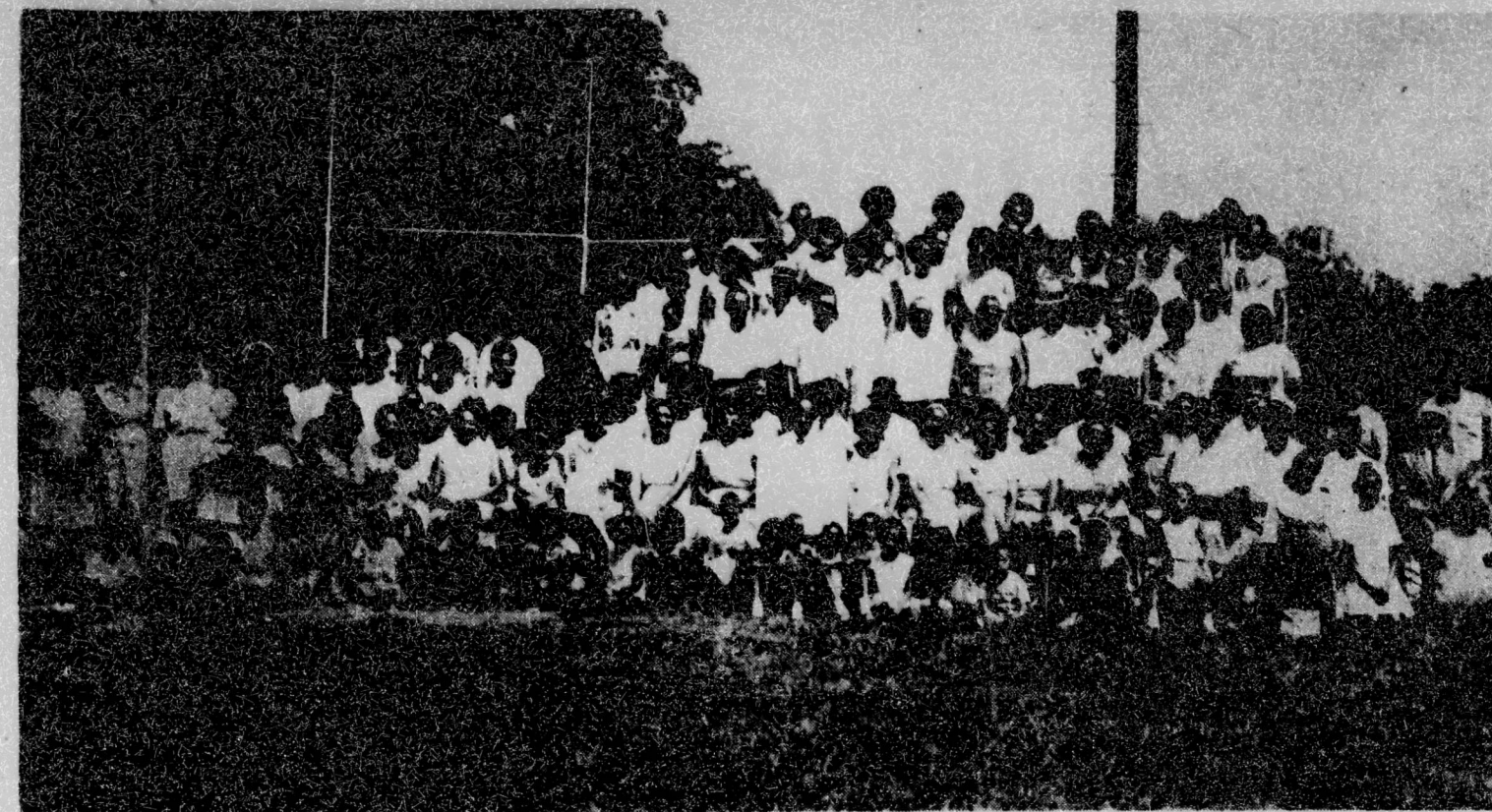
The groom is Mr. Sidney Carpenter. After a honeymoon trip to New Jersey, the couple will be at their home.

Joint Opposition

WASHINGTON - (NPD) - The NAACP and the Southern Christian Leadership conference joined forces recently to protest to President Richard M. Nixon the rumored impending nomination of Clement M. Haynesworth, chief judge, U.S. Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals, to fill the U. S. Supreme court vacancy created by the resignation of Justice Abe Fortas. Haynesworth's opinions supporting segregation in education, hospitals and recreational facilities were cited in a joint statement sent to the President, vehemently opposing the judge, who reportedly has the backing of Dixiecrat Sen. Strom Thurmond of South Carolina.
