## Foundation Curb Anti-Black

NEW YORK-(NPI)—The proposal in Congress to ban the use of foundation funds for voter registration, has been denounced by the NAACP as a veiled drive to halt the increase in the voting strength of Black Americans, particularly in the South. In a letter to the New York Times newspaper, Roy Wilkins, NAACP executive director, pointed out that "Negro citizens are not deceived by the tax reform labels because they know it is really aimed at curbing Blacks voting strength."
