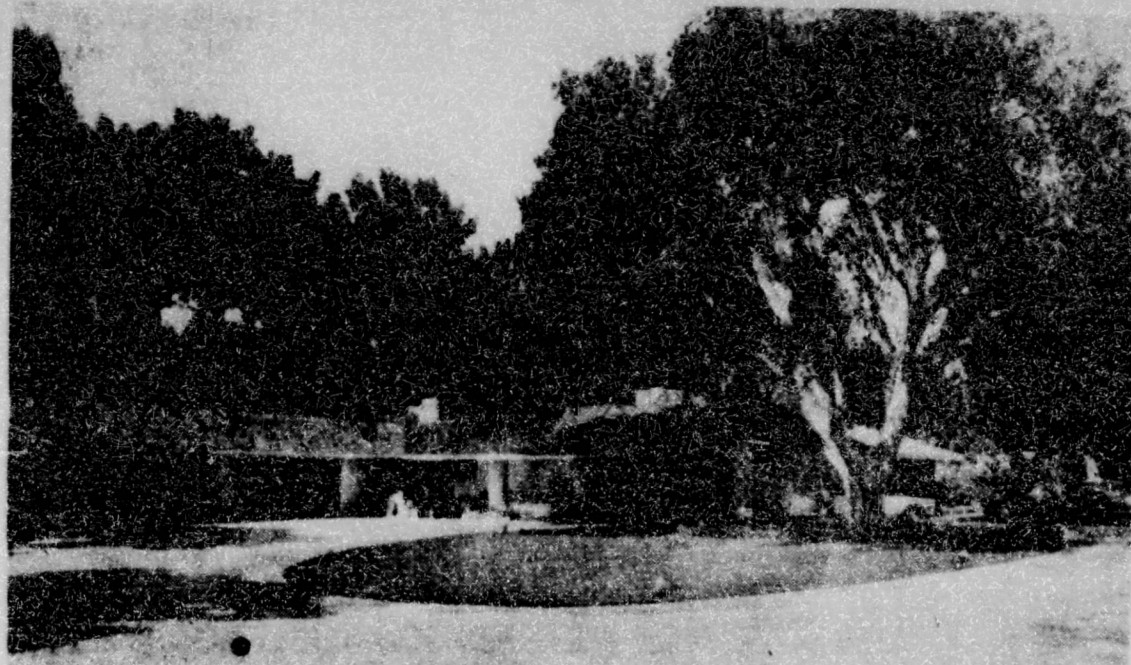

exhibition at ECSU is the fact that the artist is completely self-taught. As band director of Newbold High School, at Fort Barnwell, painting is his second great artistic interest. A native of Kinston, he received his inspiration and encouragement from his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. Ray Nixon, at an early age.

Married to the former Miss Peggie Hill, of Vanceboro, his chief critic, Canady completed his undergraduate studies at Virginia State College, where he majored in instrumental music. While serving in the U. S. Army, he graduated from and taught at the Band Training School, Fort Jackson, S. C. The musician-painter was awarded the M. A. degree in Educational Administration by North Carolina A&T State University.

Special Red Cross Train To House Hurricane Operation

WASHINGTON, D. C. - With housing and office space practically non-existent in hurricane leveled Gulfport, Miss., many of the American Red Cross disaster relief staff will live and work aboard a special train made available to the organization by Alan S. Boyd, president of the Illinois Central Railroad.

Made up of an officer car, two sleepers, a dining car, three 8,000-gallon water tank cars, and 20 baggage cars, the train and its staff are being contributed to the Red Cross by the railroad.

This action was taken earlier today when Mr. Boyd, who served in Washington as the nation's first secretary of transporta-

tion, learned that national disaster workers, sent to the Gulf Coast from all over the country, were having to commute to the disaster area from as far away as New Orleans.

The special train is scheduled to arrive in Gulfport tomorrow. The railroad is also providing portable generators and a power car which will provide electricity for essential activities in the Gulfport-Biloxi area.

The three tank cars will carry a supply of fresh drinking water for the community, which lost most of its utilities in the disaster. The baggage cars will serve to warehouse some of the relief supplies now pouring into the Gulf Coast for hurricane victims.
