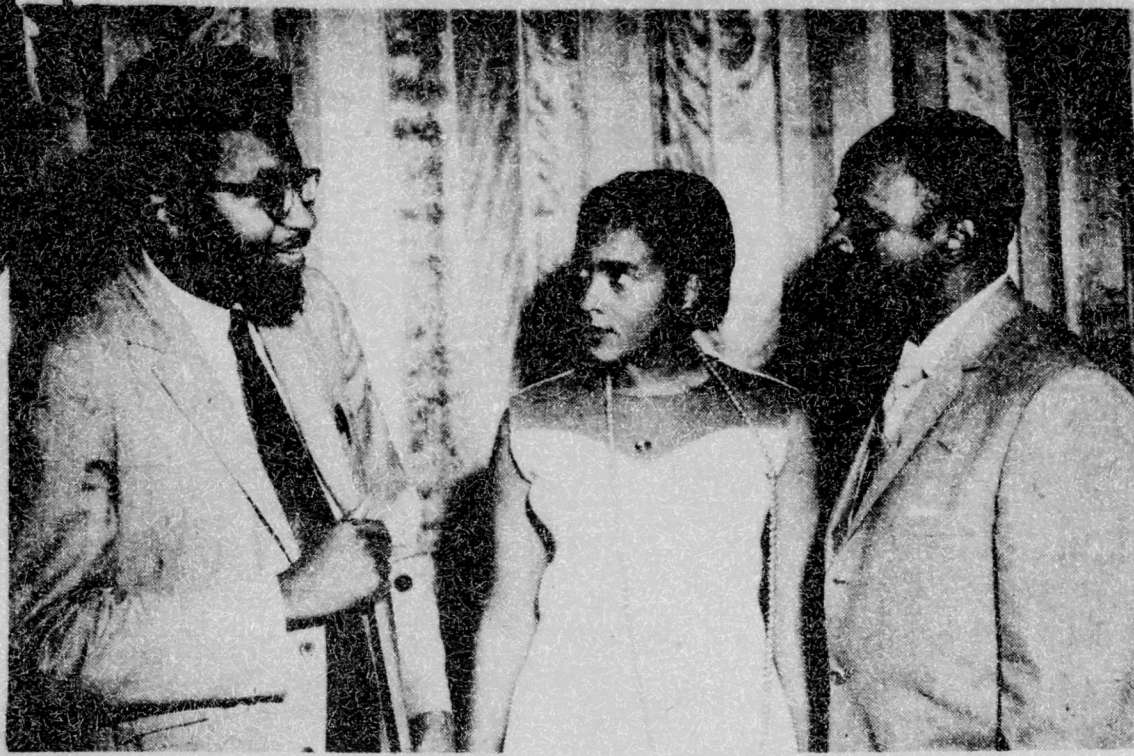


University Students To Raleigh
