OEO ANALYST VISITS CCAP
Mr. Paul Lindsay, OEO Analyst visited the Cumberland County Community Action Program this week. His interest was to talk with the directors and some of the staff and community people.

This is not a new thing. Each year before a proposal is written for the funding of another program year, the OEO Analyst visits all CAP programs in his particular district (we are in the Mid-Atlantic District) to evaluate and give advice for the betterment of the program's future.

The CAP Form 81, which is

a questionnaire developed by the Office of Economic Opportunity, and is designed to reveal the community problems and possible answers, is reviewed carefully by the analyst.

Some details in an analyst's observations may vary well aid in determining the amount of manpower needed, the amount of funds needed and other technical aspects of the CAP programs.

After the analyst's observations are clearly established in his mind, he will discuss them with CAP employees. The employees are then ready to

begin requesting funds for another program year.
CCAP BOARD DECISIONS
The CCAP Board of Directors met Thursday, September 18, at the County Courthouse to hold their regular monthly meeting.

Following are brief notes about what the Board discussed and approved:

1. The hiring of a Child Development Director; It decided to hire a Mrs. Nancy K. Emkin, effective October 1st.

2. It discussed Mr. Kenneth G. Smith's application for Director of Neighborhood Services and voted to hire him, this will be effective as of October 1st also.

3. The Board voted to request the disbursement of \$10,000 for training low-income people and sub-professional staff members. It suggested that \$5,000 be used from the 1969 budget and \$5,000 be used from the 1970 budget.

4. It accepted the resignation of Mr. Luther (Nick) Jerolds and Mr. Fred Farmer who have done remarkable jobs for CAP.

FAYETTEVILLE - Luther R. Jerolds has been named assistant business manager at Fayetteville State University, President Charles Lyons has announced.

Jerolds comes to the Fayetteville post from the Cumberland County Community Action Program where he served as Director of the Neighborhood Youth Corps from 1966-'69. The position is a new administrative post at FSU.

Speaking on behalf of the university, Dr. Lyons said "the university is fortunate to have in Mr. Jerolds a person with much experience in administration and finance and with dedication to people. We look forward to having the benefits of his talents in the important role of assistant business manager."

A native of Fayetteville, Jerolds received the B. S. C. degree in accounting from North Carolina Central University. He is presently enrolled in graduate studies at NCCU.

While a student at NCCU, Jerolds was a Business Administration Scholar and was an All-CIAA performer on the football team. He played three years of professional football with the Chicago Bears, Dallas Texans and the Edmonton Eskimos.
