## HUD Publishes Abstracts Of Planning

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development last week announced publication of Selected Abstracts of Planning Reports, a compilation of summaries of planning studies supported by HUD through the country.

The studies were carried out as part of the Comprehensive Planning Assistance Program, which is administered by HUD's Office of Metropolitan Development.

Under the program, established in the Housing Act of 1954 as amended, grants are made to State and local governments to encourage sound community, regional, and statewide planning and programming. In his introduction to the publication, Norman Beckman, Director of the Urban Management Assistant Administration, points out that the abstracts cover studies conducted in 1967 and 1968, and therefore do not reflect current planning and policies and objectives outlined in the new Comprehensive Planning Assistance Handbooks. But, he said, "the studies

do reflect the beginnings of planning that deals with housing, law enforcement, and other major issues."

The studies deal with such diverse subjects as a comprehensive plan for a village of 1,000, a land use plan for the year 1985, a data bank development program, and a work program for intergovernmental cooperation in regional planning.

Copies of planning reports also are available for reference purposes in the following places: HUD Library, Washington, D. C., and library of the HUD Regional Office serving the applicant.
