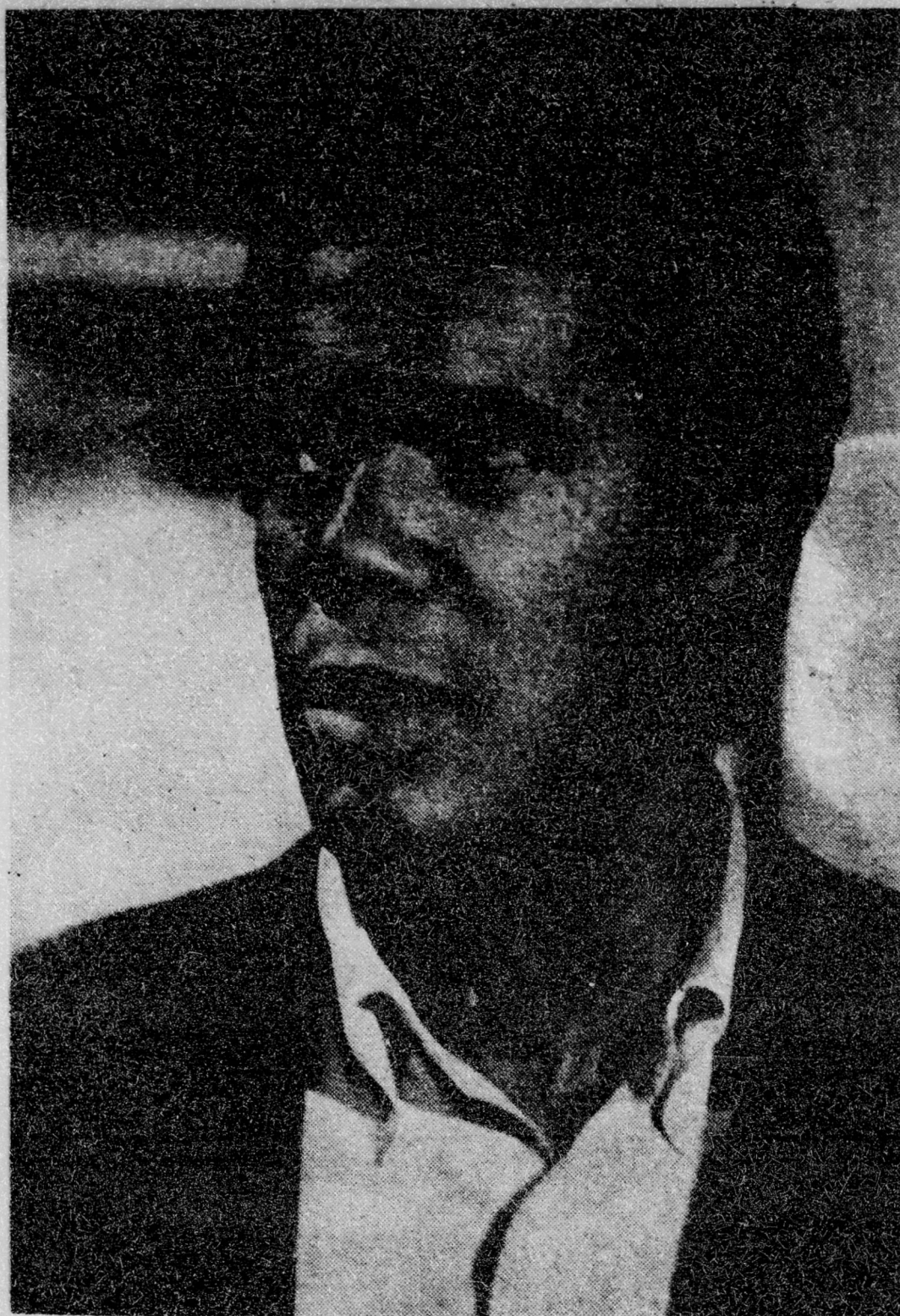

## NCCU Will Host Statewide Resource-Use Convention

**DURHAM** - North Carolina Central University will be the scene of the 23rd annual meeting of The North Carolina Resource-Use Education Conference on November 13, at Durham. The one-day conference will feature two major addresses, a Student Symposium, and fourteen Conservation-Environmental Education Workshops.

In making the announcement recently, Dr. Theodore R. Speigner, NCCU Director of the Division of Resource-Use Education and State Chairman of the Conference said: "The 1969 general theme for the Twenty-Third annual meeting is 'Environmental Education Can Make The Difference.'"

He said, "most environmental-minded people are already convinced that waste and depletion of natural and human resources constitute serious threats to the well-being of our country." Dr. Speigner pointed out that "the content of environmental education is the total physical environment of man - its social, economic, and esthetic, as well as its biological aspects." He believes that exploration of environmental education in-depth by administrators, teachers, parents and students, "will promote the highest quality of learning and living for all citizens."

The keynote address for the morning session will be delivered by the Honorable Benjamin Brown, Representative to the Georgia House of Representatives, Atlanta, Georgia.
