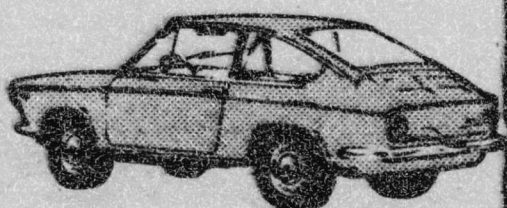

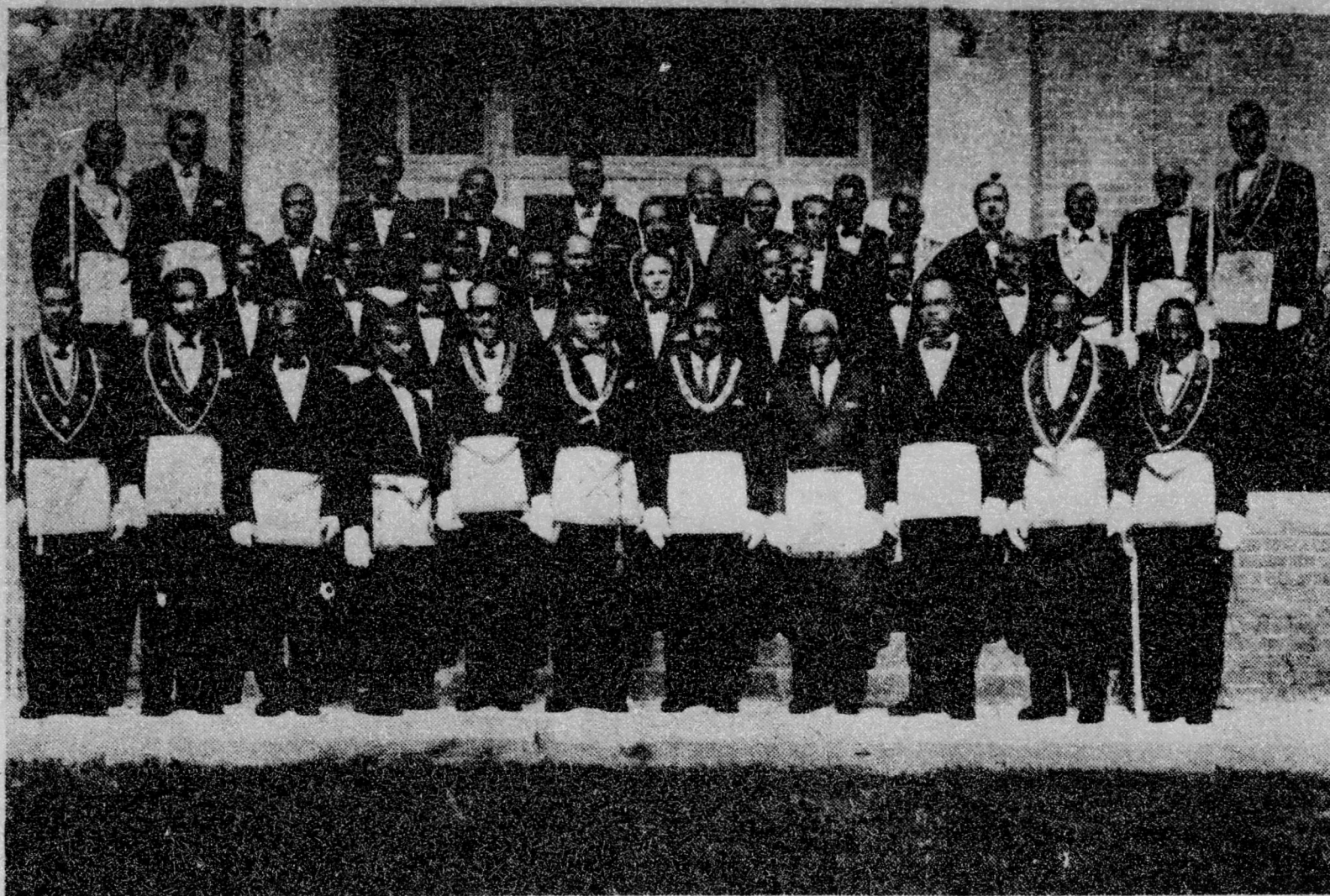

CHICAGO, Ill - A national conference on Preventive Detention will be held October 28-30 at the University of

Chicago Center for Continuing Education, 1307 East 60th Street, Chicago. Santarelli; civil rights leader Dick Gregory; professors of law Norval Morris of the University of Chicago, Richard Buxbaum of the University of California-Berkeley; professor of political science Charles Hamilton of Columbia University; Patrick Murphy of the Urban Institute; and others.

The conference was designed especially for persons involved in legislative decision-making; law enforcement on the federal, state, and local levels; members of the judiciary; members of the legal profession; and persons concerned with issues affecting civil liberties. The registration fee for the conference is \$150, which includes meals and lodging at the Center for Continuing Education.
