The voice at midnight came he started up to hear; a mortal arrow pierced his frame, he felt but felt no fear. These lines of Aaron Williams written in 1778 are appropriate for the Christian hero, in the person of the Reverend Lewis G. Young, a dynamic gospel minister. Rev. Young was an outstanding minister in the United Holiness Church of America. He was courageous, uncompromising and always steadfast in the things he believed honest, right and just. Elder Young was a native of Vance County and reared



in the Greystone section. He began his ministry at an early age, in his home community and organized a church known as New Bethel Holy Church of which he pastored for a period of 60 years. Elder Young was also known as a church builder. He was instrumental in the building of the Flint Hill Holiness Church of Henderson, Salemburg and Enfield. His motto: Holiness or Hell, with out no man sees the Lord, Elder Young was a member of the General Board of Elders of the United Holiness Church, a member of the Board of Elders for the Southern District Convocation. He was also District Elder for the Central District for many years. At the time of his death October 17th, 1969, he was pastor of the churches above mention. 37 years at the Evergreen Church and 51 years at the Plumline Church. He was eulogized by the Rt. Bishop W. N. Strobar and who is also general president of the United Holiness Church. He se-

lected for a text; the words from the 20th book of Timothy verse 4-7: "I have fought a good fight, I have kept the faith." Elder Young will be missed not only in the Holiness Church, but in other churches as well. The family who speaks of this passing, says "he was a living husband and father, a trust worthy friend and a wonderful counselor who precepts and examples were mightily respected. We are sorry not as one who has no hope, for his testimony was, "I have built my nest in the word of God and I mean to die in the word of God."

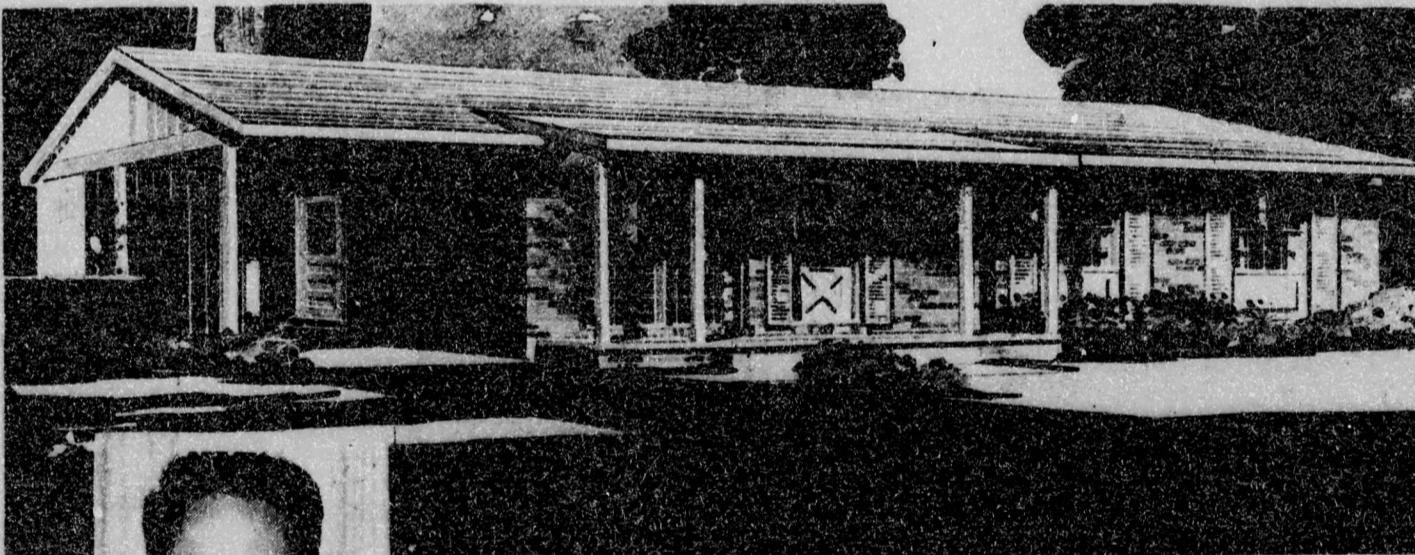

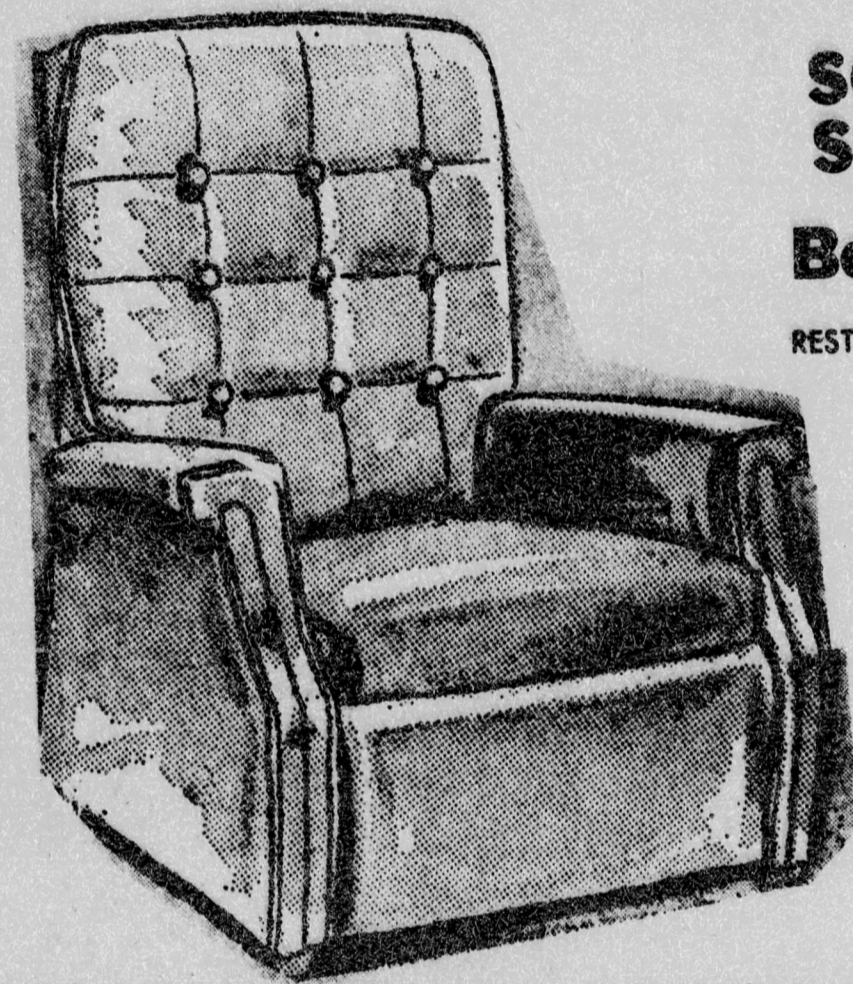

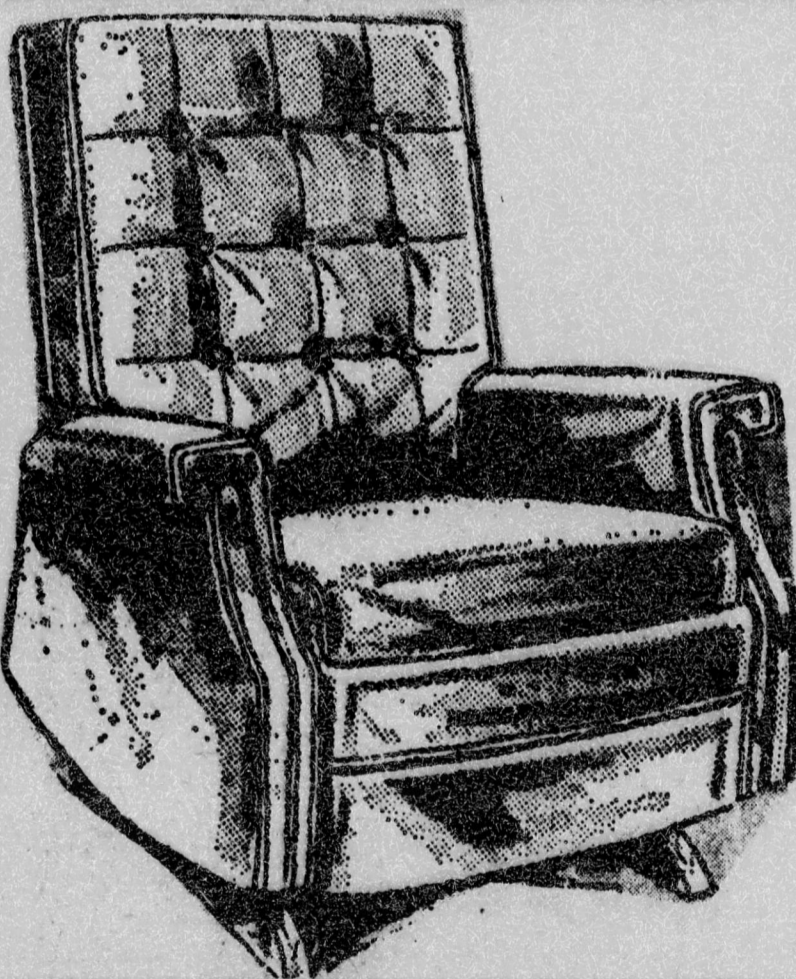
