Results of the study appear in the current Elementary School Journal, published by the University of Chicago Press.

Sixty fourth grade students were randomly selected. Thirty were tutored in arithmetic by six graduate students in Ferkauf's educational psychology program. The remaining subjects received no tutoring.

Both experimental groups showed consistent progress over the six-month period with little difference in the two tutored groups.

According to the article, "The results indicate that the two most important factors for improved achievement were the social reinforcement afforded by the relationship between the

tutor and his pupil, and a teaching curriculum realistically developed for a particular child's individual needs."
