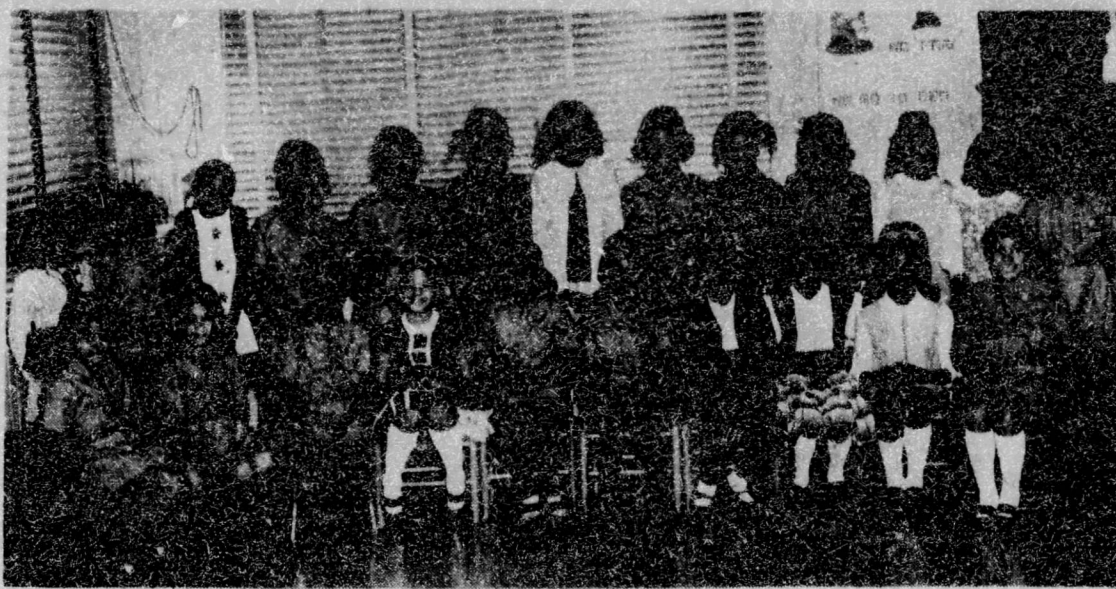


## THE GOSPEL WORLD
