He was of medium complexion and wore white trousers.

males." Nothing was taken from him, he stated, but he thinks he cut one of his attackers. Mr. McLaurin reported neck and left eye injuries.

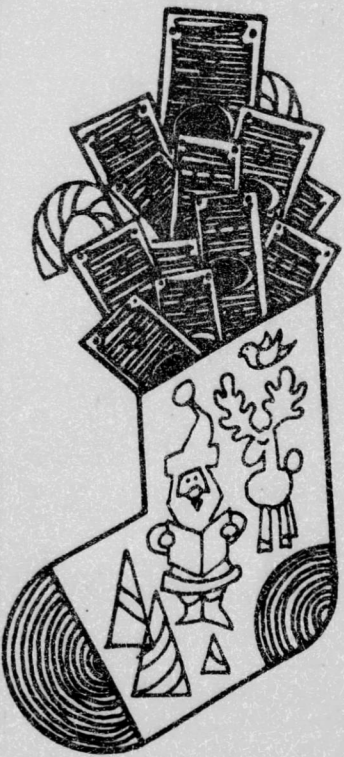
DRINKING HUBBY JAILED

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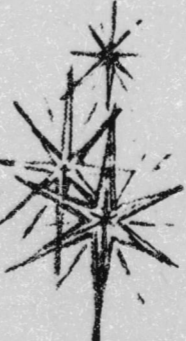
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
