DETROIT, Mich. - Motown's fabulous Temptations joined forces with Sen. Edward Kennedy this week in Detroit to lend support to Michigan Democratic Senator Philip A. Hart in his reelection bid.

The Temptations - Melvin Franklin, Dennis Edwards, Otis Williams and Eddie Kendricks were V. I. P. guests of Sen. Kennedy at a dinner reception at the Recess Club in Detroit's Fisher Building.

Detroit's most important labor leaders were on hand to lend their support to Sen. Hart - UAW President Leonard Woodcock, Vice President Douglas Frazier, Secretary-

Treasurer Emil Mazey and Regional Director Marcellus Ivory; Hershel Womack, of the Retail Clerk's Union; USW District Director Charles Youngblood; Jimmy Watts, President of the Michigan Conference of the NAACP, along with Detroit NAACP Chapter President Thomas Turner; Detroit City Clerk George Edwards and Walter Green, representing Mayor Roman Gribbs.

From the Recess Club the Temptations and Senators Kennedy and Hart traveled to the Raleigh House, in nearby Southfield, Michigan, where the senators spoke briefly and the Temps performed to an audience of over 3,000 enthusiastic Hart supporters.

At the Raleigh House Motown's famous quintet was introduced by Senator Kennedy to climax the program with a splendid performance that animated the audience to clapping hands and tapping toes to the Motown beat of the Temps own rhythm section and the Jimmy Wilkins' dance band.

The Temptations rocked into their recent hit tune, "Ball of Confusion," and the young Hart boosters jammed closer to the stage to feel the vibrations of that "now" sound. The sound was so heavy, the tune so hot that it blew the circuits in all the microphones and the throbbing PA system suddenly went dead.
