PETERSBURG, Va.-Virginia State College will officially welcome more than 800 students to freshmen classes on Wednesday, Sept. 9, at 8 a.m. A predicted enrollment of approximately 3,000 students are expected at all classes at the college this fall.

A full week of Freshmen Orientation Activities will get underway on campus Tuesday, Sept. 1, starting at 8 a.m. According to an announcement from LTC R. M. VSC Signs Nine Cagers

PETERSBURG - Virginia State College head basketball Coach Harold Deane has announced the signing of the following nine players who, though freshmen, will play on the Trojan varsity in CIAA action this winter. They are:

James Wyche, a 6-4, 166-lb. center from Woodson High in Hopewell, Va. Wyche, after three years in the army, is returning to the area where he was an all-state and all-district standout, leading woodson to a 25-3 record in 1966 as team captain. He averaged 20 points and 20 rebounds a game.

Coach Deane calls Wyche a "very vicious rebounder and a great effort man." Eugene Henry, a 6-2, 180-lb. forward-guard from Woodson High in Hopewell. Also spent three years in the army, he was honorable mention all-state and was all-district with Wyche in 1966, averaging 19.9 points and 16 rebounds a game. Coach Deane says Henry is "a great competitor with great leaping ability and is very quick."

Richard B. Phillips, a 6-6, 178-lb. center from Peabody High in Petersburg, Va. Another military vet, Phillips led the Peabody Lions in rebounding and shot-blocking in 1966 when he received all-district honors. Deane says Phillips has "great leaping ability, is a good rebounder and has great potential."

Frank R. Morton, a 6-4, 18-year-old forward from Armstrong High in Richmond, Va. Captain of his high school squad, Morton was all-district and all-region in 1969. He led the team in scoring with 19.3 a game and rebounds with 12.3 Coach Deane says Morton is a "good all-around ball-player and team man. He comes ready to play and has good jump-shooting ability."

Linwood Johnson, a 6-7, 190-lb. center from A. T. Johnson High in Montrose, Va. Also a team captain, Johnson was honorable mention Group II all-state and was all-district. He led his team in scoring (23.2) and rebounding (16.7). Deane says Johnson has a good shooting touch and has a great potential. "He is getting stronger," the Coach added.
