

J. C. Smith's Bulls Overcome A&T's Aggies For 24-20 Win In Charlotte

Bulls Begin 'Bombing' In First Qtr.

CHARLOTTE—In an action-packed contest in Charlotte's Memorial Stadium, the Golden Bulls of Johnson C. Smith edged the Aggies of A&T State 24-20 Saturday night. The CIAA contest left the Bulls 2-0 in conference play and 2-1 overall, while dropping the Greensboro visitors to 0-1 CIAA State and 1-3 against all opponents.

The sixty-minute night battle was action packed; the lead changed hands five times before Bulls' quarterback Elroy Duncan put the herd on top for good with a one yard plunge late in the fourth period.

After exchanging the ball for several series, the Bulls launched a scoring march midway through the first fifteen minutes of play; the drive was terminated with a Walter Coleman field goal from the 11.

The Aggies came rushing back to the lead on a quarterback rollout by scramble Charlie Middleton. The eighteen yard punt around end came at the end of the first stanza; John Guy added the conversion and the Aggies lead 7-3.

J. C. Smith made it 11-7 with 12 minutes remaining in the second quarter when split end Joe Johnson grabbed a 5 yard Duncan aerial in the end zone; the same combination clicked for the two point conversion on a sparkling pass play. Aggie fullback Harold Riley put the Aggies ahead again with three minutes to play in the second quarter on an 8 yard off tackle play. Guy missed the point, and the teams went to the lockers for halftime with the Bulls trailing A&T 13-11.

Duncan put the Bulls on top following the second half kickoff with a two yard plunge over center for the score. Coleman's kick was wide; the Bulls were up 17-13. Riley gave A&T its last early in the fourth quarter on a two yard dive. Guy made the point and the score was 20-17.

"Skinny Roy" Duncan put the icing on the cake late in the fourth quarter. Following a pass interference call on the Aggies 7 against the visitors, Elroy dove over a pike of blue jerseyed Aggies from the one to give the Bulls all the points needed for victory. The kick was good by Coleman, and Smith was on top for good 24-20 with six minutes remaining.

With the victory, the Bulls continue on top of the CIAA's Southern Division. The Hard plays Morris Brown in Atlanta Saturday afternoon in a non-conference tilt.

'Dogs Lose To Rattlers By 28 To 10

ORANGEBURG, S. C.—Florida A&M University exploded for two touchdowns in the fourth quarter and went on to defeat South Carolina State College, 28-10, Saturday night in an SIAC football game in Bulldog Stadium.

The Rattlers scored on a three-yard burst by halfback Glen Edwards and a one-yard smash by running back Fred Warren to put the game out of reach of the determined Bulldogs.

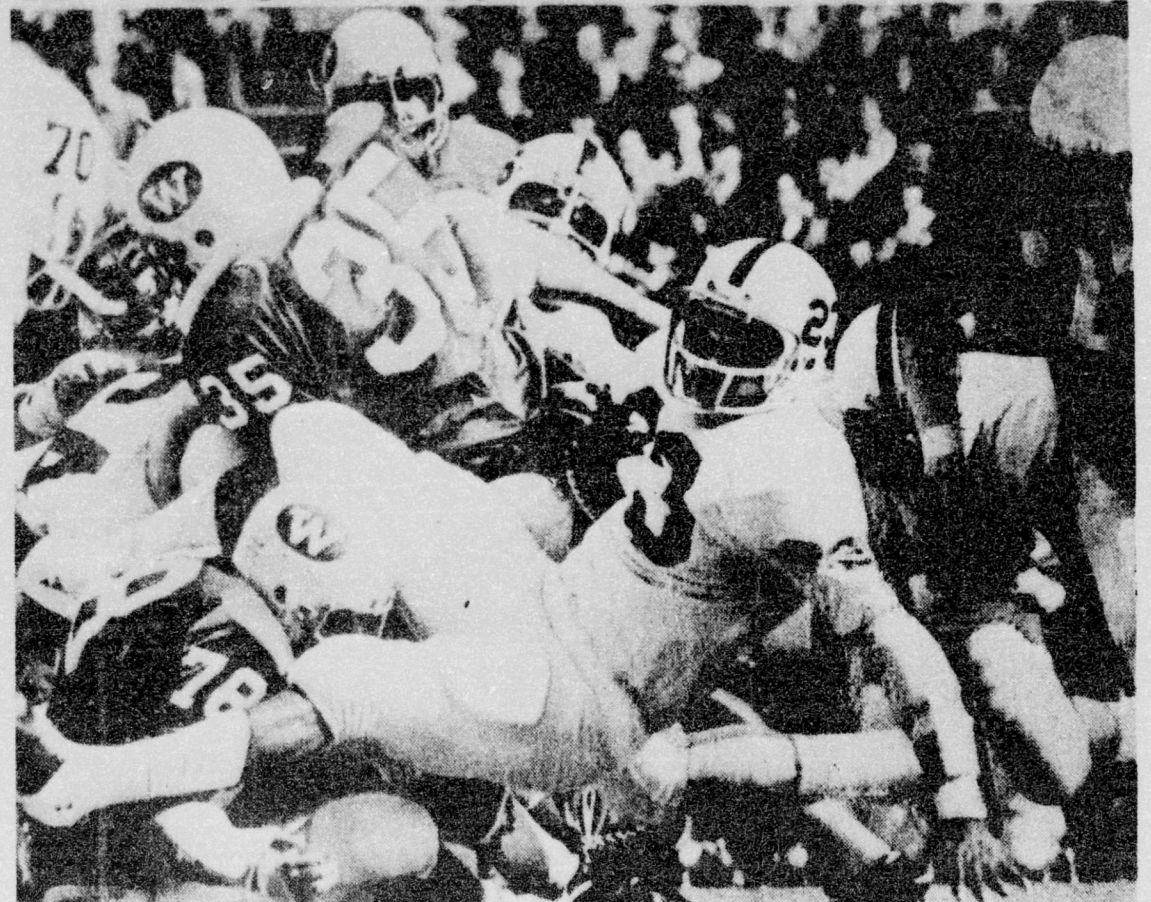
It was a disappointing defeat to the 8,972 spectators who jammed Bulldogs Stadium hoping for an upset of the Rattlers who have dominated the 17-year series, 14-2-1.

S. C. State yielded the first touchdown early in the game as the Rattlers struck the first time they got their hands on the football. It was an 84-yard much in 10 plays that gave the Rattlers a 6-0 advantage with less than five minutes gone in the first period. Joseph Jewett kicked the extra point.

The Bulldogs threatened with their defensive tackle James Evans separated quarterback Steve Scruggs from the ball and middle guard Joe Hudson fell on it at the S. C. State 44.

Sophomore quarterback Ben Samuels tossed a 47-yard pass to end William Clark that put the ball at the Florida 1.

Then the alert Rattler defense picked off one of Samuels' passes, killing that drive at the visitors' four-yard line.

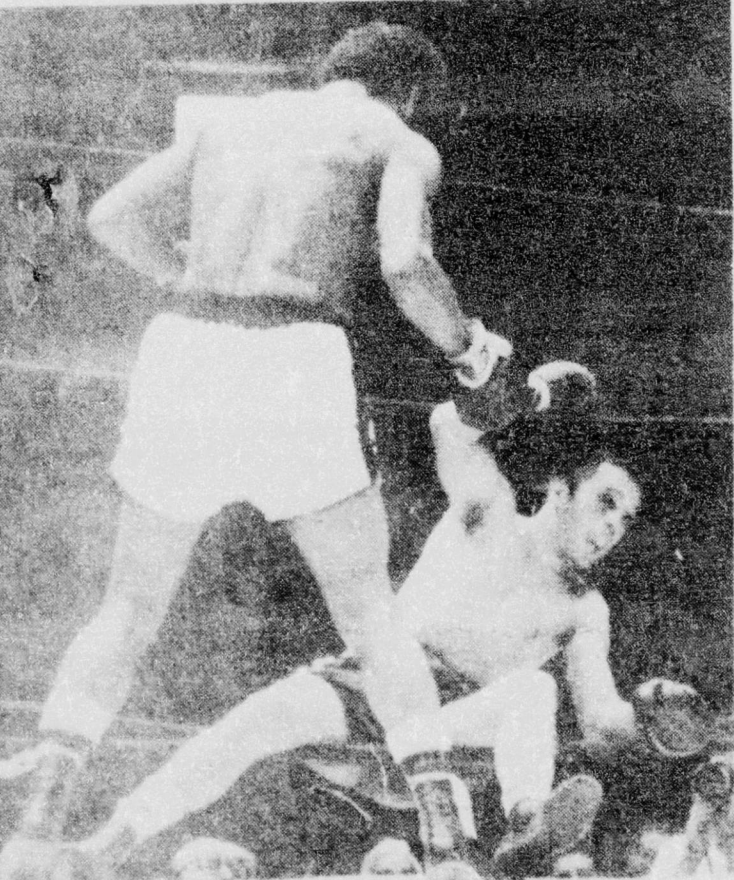
Farr Sparks Lions Past Bears, 28-14

DETROIT—Sparked by the running of Mel Farr and Albie Taylor and the pass defense of Dick Lebeau, the Detroit Lions gained sole possession of first place in the touch Central Division of the National Football Conference by defeating the previously unbeaten Chicago Bears here Monday night, 28-14.

Farr and Taylor repeatedly found gaping holes in the Bears' defensive line and quarterback Bill Munson blended in his passing game to go along with the play of the defensive unit for Detroit, which is now 4-0 for the season.

Chicago took a 7-0 lead the dressing room at intermission on a 20-yard touchdown strike from Jack Concannon to Dick Gordon, who beat Detroit's cornerback Lem Barney in the first quarter. But the Lions, feeling the results of the first touchdown scored against them this season, came back in the third period to score three six-pointers to take a 21-7 lead after three quarters of play.

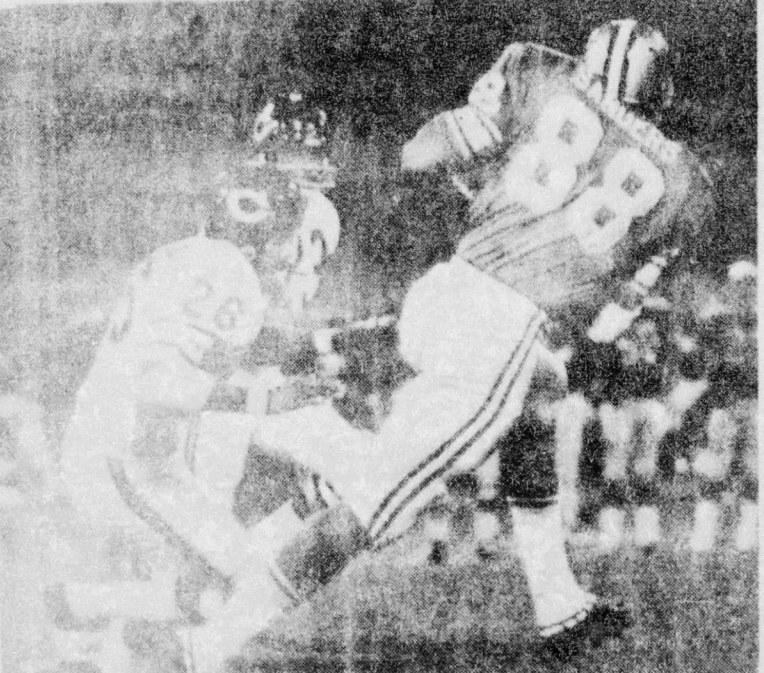
