
## Music Appreciation

The change in president stook place this afternoon at a reception honoring General Collins for his years of service to the Red Cross and the nation.

During his term as the organization's chief executive, General Collins guided the Red Cross through some of its most trying and difficult years, his associates pointed out. To serve members of the U.

S. armed forces in Vietnam, he built the American Red Cross staff in Southeast Asia from a mere handful in 1964 to more than 350 workers a few years later.
