## Alumni Holds Anniversary Banquet In Greensboro Inn

FAYETTEVILLE—Some forty  
alumni of Fayetteville State U-  
niversity, representing the  
TRAID CHAPTER, gathered re-  
cently at the King Inn Restau-  
rant in Greensboro for their  
First Annual Dinner Meeting.  
The Group represented alumni  
from Greensboro, High Point,  
Burlington and Martinsville,  
Va.

Dr. R. L. Hannon, Director  
of Development and Universi-  
ty Relations was the guest  
speaker for the occasion. In  
this talk, he highlighted the  
building program, scholar-  
ships, academic affairs and  
institutional expansion. Dr.  
Hannon's major emphasis was  
placed on the topic of the high  
cost of operating an institution  
of higher learning and the needs  
of greater financial support for  
FSU by its alumni. He listed  
several reasons for the high  
cost of operating an institu-  
tion including:

(1) A demand for increased  
services by an increased num-  
ber of students, (2) inflation,  
(3) special programs for the  
disadvantaged, (4) new cur-  
riculums, (5) increased  
salaries, (6) increased insur-  
ance costs, and (7) maintenance  
and in some instances graduate  
offerings.

The group discussed the An-  
nual Fund Program and pledged  
to support the same.

A pictorial tour of the old and  
new campuses was presented by  
J. A. Fulmore.

A taped interview with Dr. J.  
W. Seabrook, President  
Emeritus of Fayetteville State  
University, proved to be very  
stimulating and exciting to all  
members.
