Florida A&M Establishes Program

In 1955, Florida A&M University organized what we now call The Training Program in Speech Pathology and Audiology which has for its purpose preparing personnel for employment in public schools.

The graduates tend to the speech, voice, language and

hearing problems of handicapped children in public schools. Children with articulatory, language, and voice problems are given therapy individually and in small groups in a public school system.

Usually, the practitioner travels by automobile to work with children needing help with their speech and language problems of a very serious nature. The speech pathologist is not a speech improvement teacher, but rather a therapist working with deep-seated communication problems.

Since 1955, FAMU's program has graduated 190 speech therapists. It has trained 90 percent of the black therapists in the state of Florida. More than this, its speech therapy trainees are working now in Alabama, Maryland, Virginia, South Carolina, Georgia and Minnesota.

At the end of four years, a student graduates with the B.S. degree in speech pathology. Dr. Marcus H. Boulware, program director, will be glad to send interested high school students information about this program.

Former Shaw University Dean Buried Mon. In Creedmoor

Dr. John Tilley, son of the late Harvey and Emma Tilley, was born August 7, 1898 in Granville County. He departed this life April 27 following an extended illness. Funeral services were held Monday, May 3, at Mount Zion Baptist Church, Creedmoor.

He received his early education in the Public Schools of Granville and Durham Counties.

He continued his studies at what is now North Carolina Central University at Durham, North Carolina. His A. B. and

Doctor of Divinity Degrees were received from Shaw University in Raleigh, North Carolina. He later attended the University of Chicago where he received his B. D., masters and Ph.D. Degrees. He also did Post Graduate work at this University.

He was former pastor of Mount Vernon Baptist Church, Creedmoor, North Carolina, Mount Gilead Baptist Church, Durham, North Carolina, First Baptist Church, Apex, North Carolina as well as other local churches. He was a Master

Mason of the Mount Vernon Lodge #74, Creedmoor, North Carolina and also Moderator of the East Cedar Grove Association for a period of time. For seventeen years, he was an instructor at Shaw University. His position at the University included the following: Acting Dean of the College of Arts and Science, Dean of the School of Religion, Director of Public Relations and Alumni Affairs. Other experiences in-

clude: President of Florida Normal and Industrial College; Director of Voter Education and Registration; Office Manager of the Baltimore Branch of the NAACP; visiting lecturer of the School of Religion at Howard University, Washington, D. C.

He was married to Miss Phyllis Jones in the early 30's and to this union two children were born.

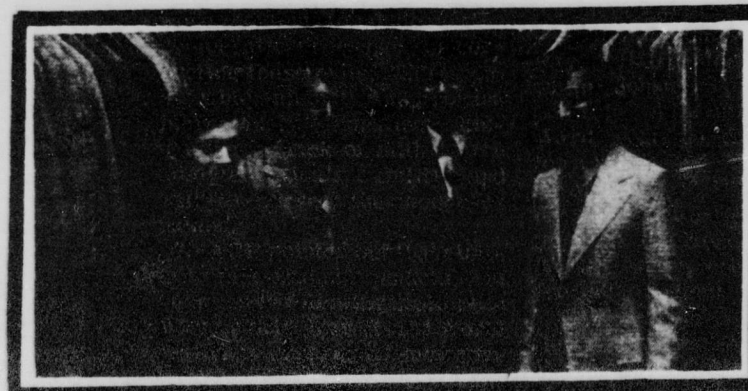
