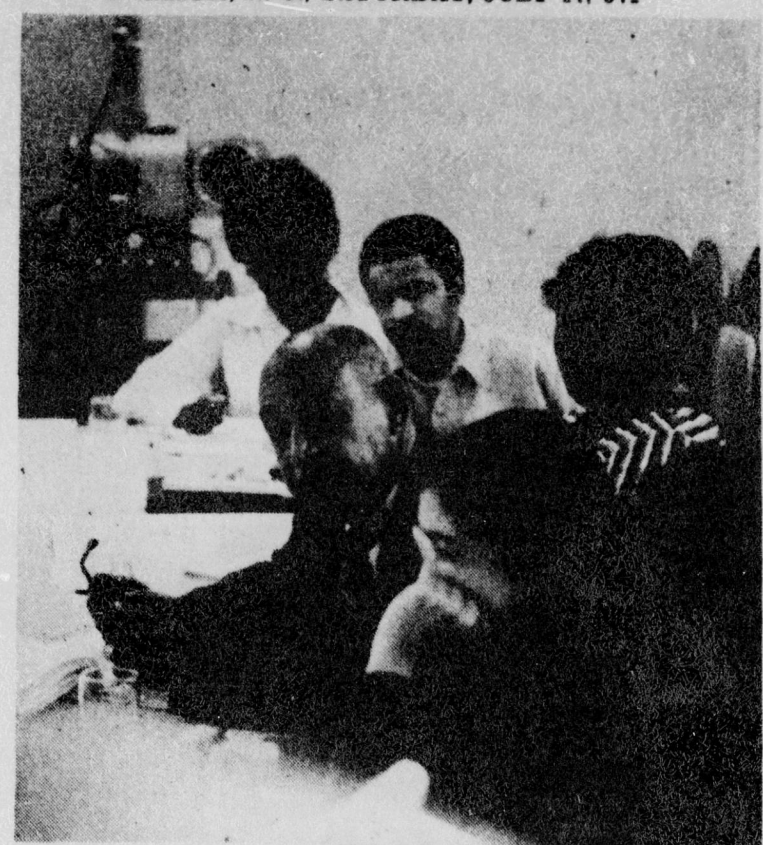

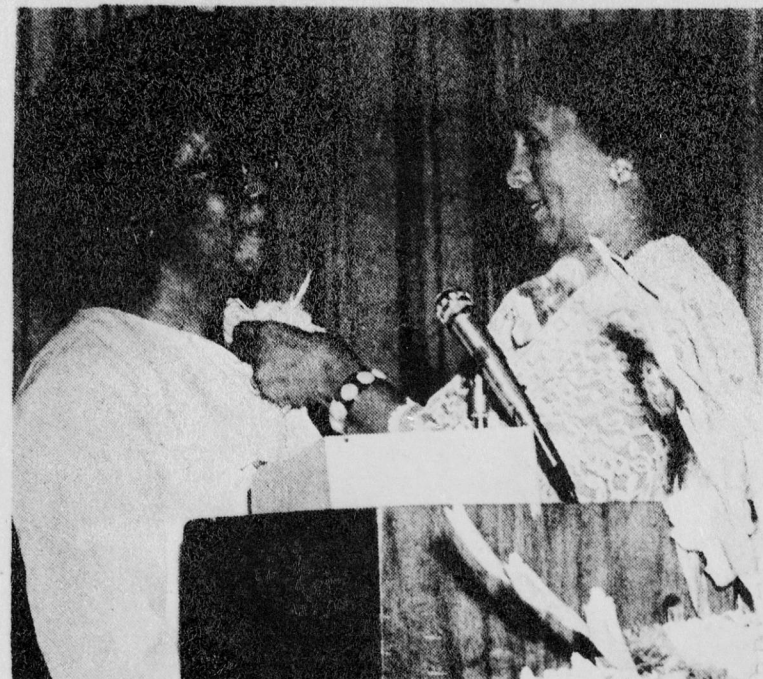
Cadet Mitchell is a member of the AFROTC unit at East Carolina University. He is a 1968 graduate of E. E. Smith Senior High School.
