## Tuttle Benefit Continues To Roll

Contributions pledged for the new building project of Tuttle Community Center have passed the halfway mark.

At an evening meeting of volunteer workers last Thursday, a tally of pledges revealed that \$24,273 was contributed since the last count was taken a week ago, when the total stood at \$59,046.

To date, a total of \$83,419 has been contributed toward the \$165,000 minimum goal. The bulk of the increase came from the campaign's advance gifts division, which rose from its July 8 total of \$34,460 to \$52,238.

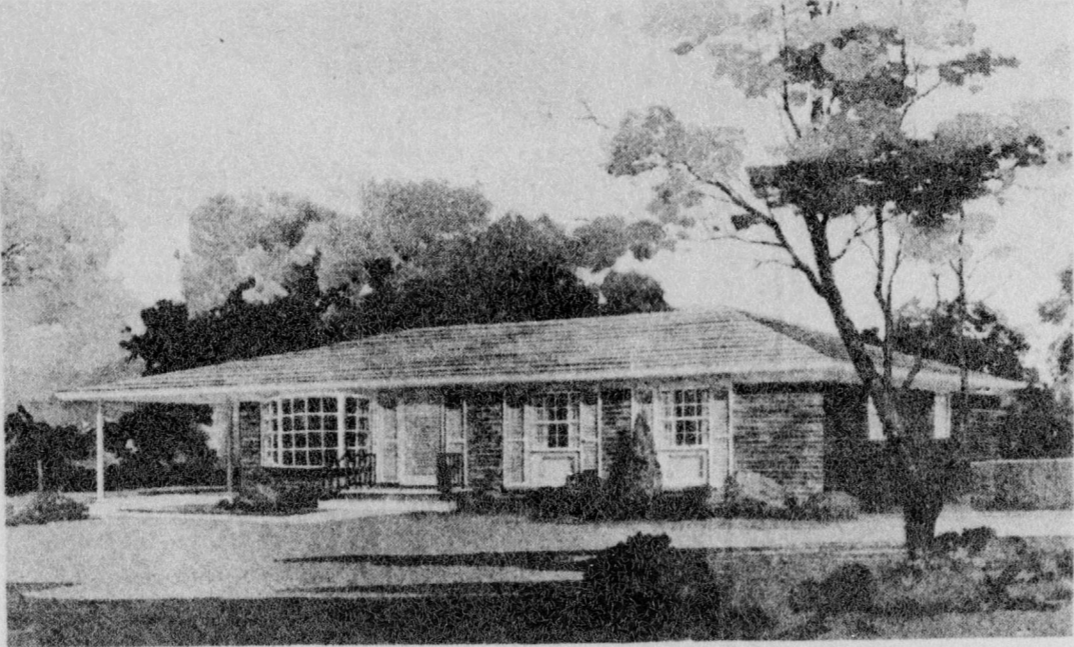
James W. Reid, general campaign chairman expressed his sincere thanks and appreciation to all those present for their great performance to date.

Reid announced that the drive has been officially extended for an additional two week period, to July 30, 1971, to allow workers more time to complete their solicitations.

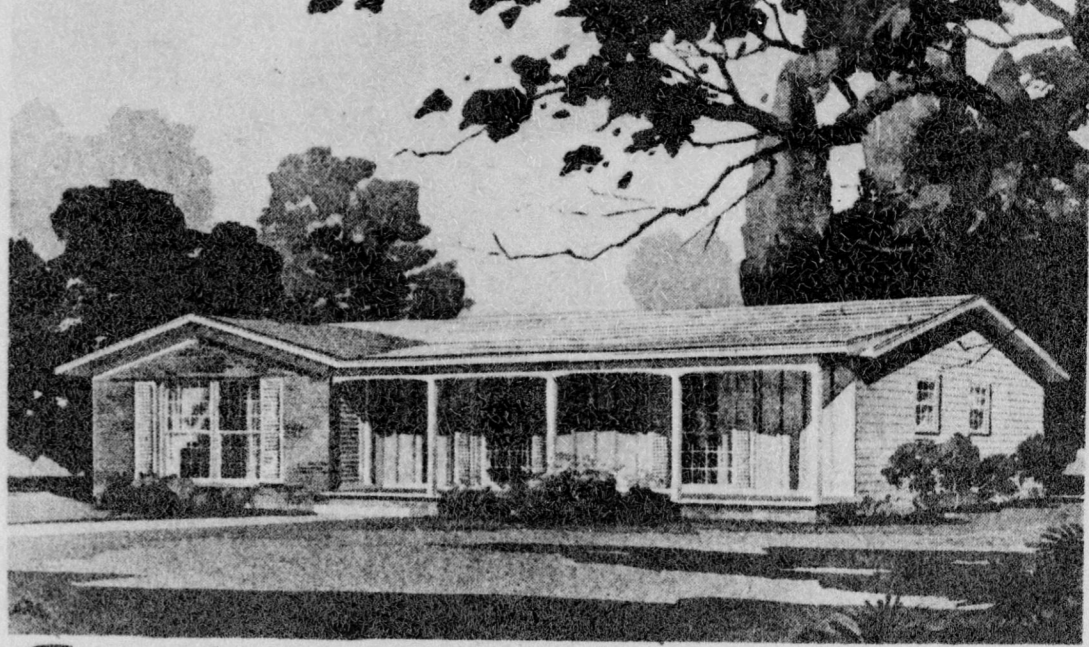

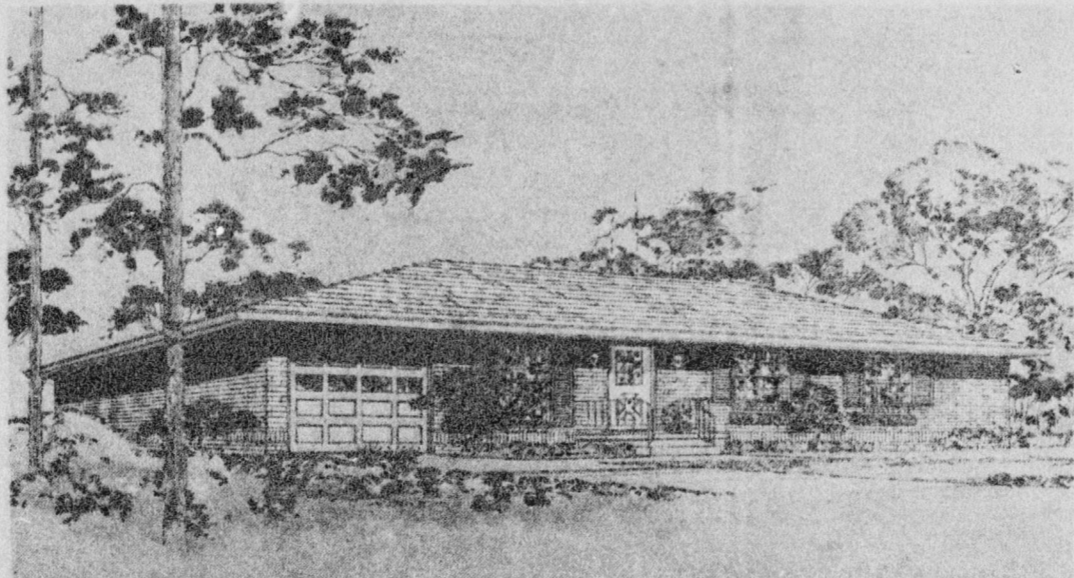

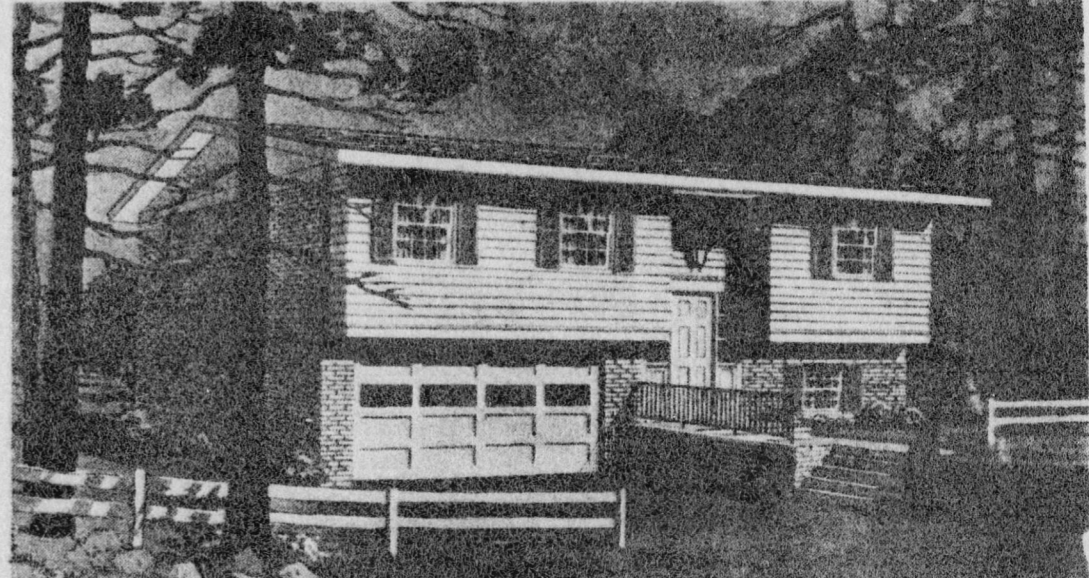
