The project approved today will serve Lenoir Community College, which is providing occupational training programs to help residents of the area qualify for industrial employment.

The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency is making a \$930-270 grant and the Coastal Plains Regional Commison, a \$160,-000 grant for the waste-treatment phase of the project. The city of Kinston will provide \$1,-814,500 in local funds to complete the \$3,949,000 total cost.

In addition to extending the water and sewer lines to serve industrial and residential areas, the funds will enable the city to build a waste-treatment plant and pumping stations.


