dents who wish more flexibility in educational environment and modes of learning, employed persons wishing to pursue education part-time for career objectives, and persons who may wish to pursue a degree at home for personal reasons.

The opening date for the Center for Community Services will be announced in the near future. The center will serve as a clearing-house for business management information, plan and conduct seminars, conferences and discussions of public interest, offer programs of cultural interest to the community of Durham, and engage in sex education including campaign against the unnecessary use of drugs.

Cooperative summer school program for high school juniors is tentatively scheduled to start in June 1972. The aim of this program is to generate interest among high school juniors in learning, thereby making entry into colleges or universities of their choice a realistic hope.

Courses to be taught will include how to prepare for standardized examinations with emphasis on the scholastic aptitude test, Basic mathematics, English Fundamental, reading skills, and Social science. Finally, a workshop including a field trip designed to expose the participants to different career opportunities in government, business, and industry will be planned.
