Perry, will be the Woman's Day speak-er at Grace AME Zion Church, Sunday, September 26at 11a.m. She received her elementary and high school education in Durham, having attended Lyon Park Elementary School, Whitted Junior High, Hillside (one year) and she received her high school diploma at Durham High in the spring of 1962.

She was one of the first Negro students to attend a previously all caucasian high school in Durham. She attended North Carolina College at Durham, (now North Carolina Central University), majoring in English and Music Education with a French minor. She was president of the Women's Student Government, Basileus of Alpha Chi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, graduating with cum laude honors, receiving the Hamilton-Shepard Award for the most outstanding contribution to student life for four collegiate years, appearing in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities for 1966, and she was also a member of the college choir.

Miss Perry also received a Master of Education Degree in Guidance and Personnel Services at North Carolina State University, Raleigh, 1970-71. She has been employed as a high school English teacher in Lynchburg, Virginia and Prin-
