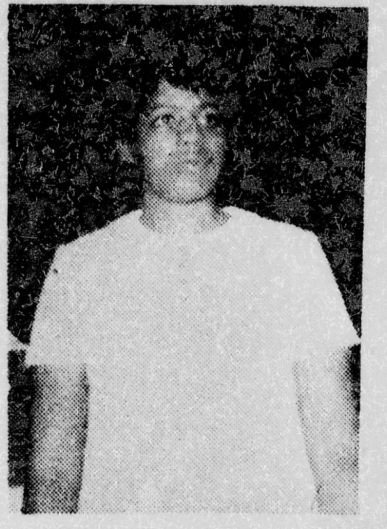

Miss Joyce L. Perry, a daughter of Rev. and Mrs. L. P. Perry, will be the Woman's Day speaker at Grace AME Zion Church, Sunday, September 28 at 11 a.m. She received her elementary and high school education in Durham, having attended Lyon Park Elementary School, Whittier Junior High, Hillside (one year) and she received her high school diploma at Durham High in the spring of 1962. She was one of the first Negro students to attend a previously all caucasian high school in Durham. She attended North Carolina College at Durham, (now North Carolina Central University), majoring in English and Music Education with a French minor. She was president of the Women's Student Government, Basileus of Alpha Chi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, graduating with cum laude honors, receiving the Hamilton-Shepard Award for the most outstanding contribution to student life for four collegiate years, appearing in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities for 1966, and she was also a member of the college choir. Miss Perry also received a Master of Education Degree in Guidance and Personnel Services at North Carolina State University, Raleigh, 1970-71. She has been employed as a high school English teacher in Lynchburg, Virginia and Prin-

cess Anne County in Maryland. At present, she is employed as a high school counselor at Enloe Senior High, Raleigh. She is affiliated with Grace Chapel AME Zion Church, where her father, Rev. 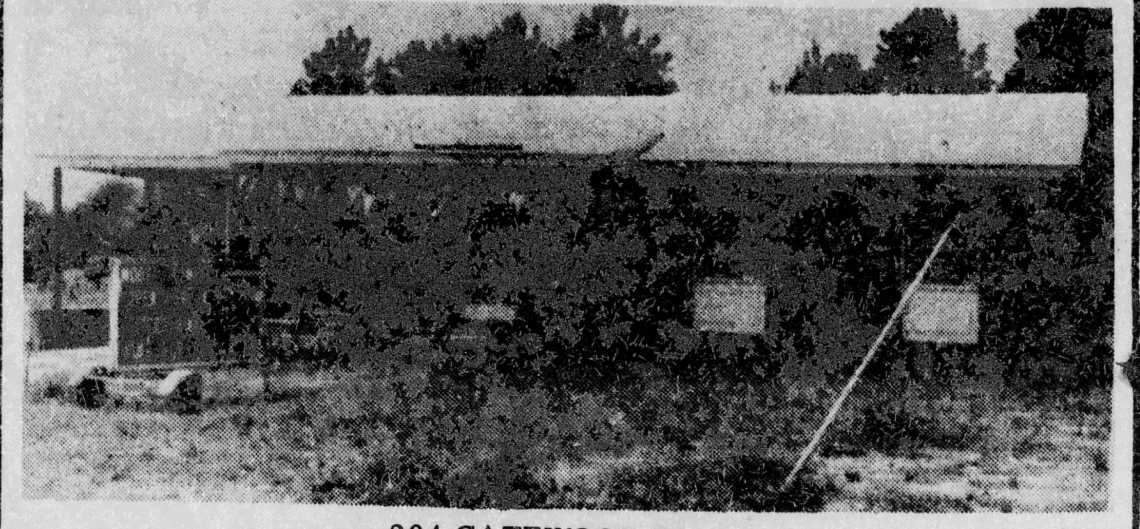

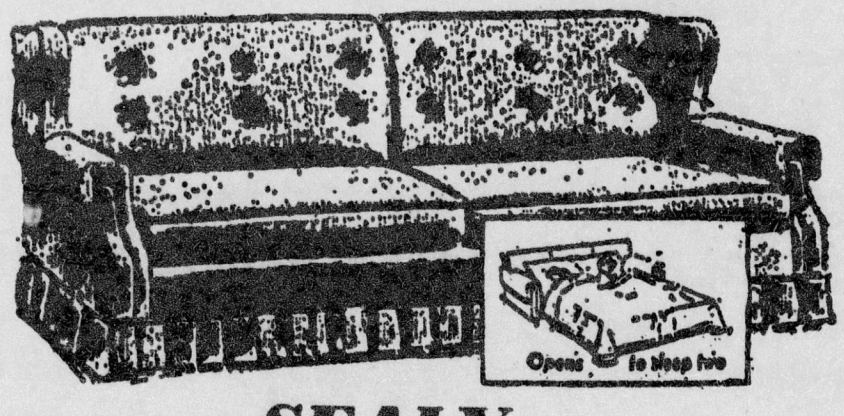
