Cosby, 'Electric Company,' Generate Word Power

CHAPEL HILL -- "Turning On" seems to be a major pastime these days, and "turning on" is precisely the whole idea behind THE ELECTRIC COMPANY, a television series which premieres the week of October 25 on University of North Carolina Television.

THE ELECTRIC COMPANY, developed and produced by the SESAME STREET people (children's Television Workshop), teaches basic reading skills to children ages 7-10. The program is a classroom supplement for on-going reading instruction, and is of value to older children and adults with reading problems.

The half-hour, daily programs will be seen at 12:30 p. m. and 6:00 p. m. Monday-Friday over the six UNC-TV channels: Channel 4, WUNC-TV, Chapel Hill; Channel 2, WUND-TV, Columbia; Channel 17, WUNE-TV, Linville; Channel 33, WUNF-TV, Asheville; Channel 58, WUNG-TV, Con-

cord; Channel 39, WUNJ-TV, Wilmington.

THE ELECTRIC COMPANY is a combination of the talents of a repertory group of actors, including Bill Cosby and Rita Moreno, and extensive use of television's electronic capabilities.

In response to recent studies that indicate that as many as one-fourth to one-half of the population are functional illiterates--people who cannot read and understand a newspaper, a job application or directions on a medicine bottle--the Workshop began almost two years of research into television's ability to teach reading.

THE ELECTRIC COMPANY is aimed primarily at beginning readers who are experiencing difficulty, and hopes to teach basic skills as well as to generate enthusiasm for reading.

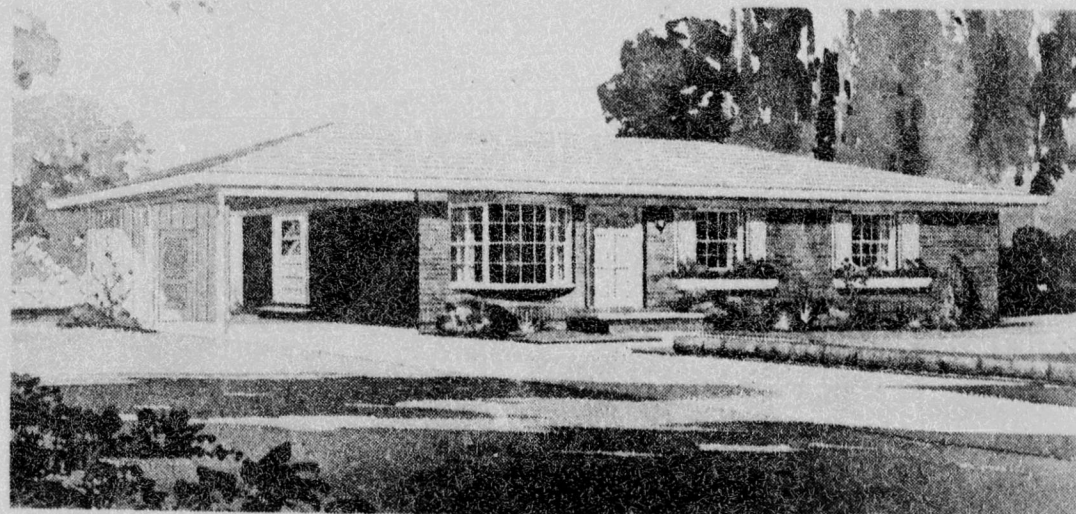

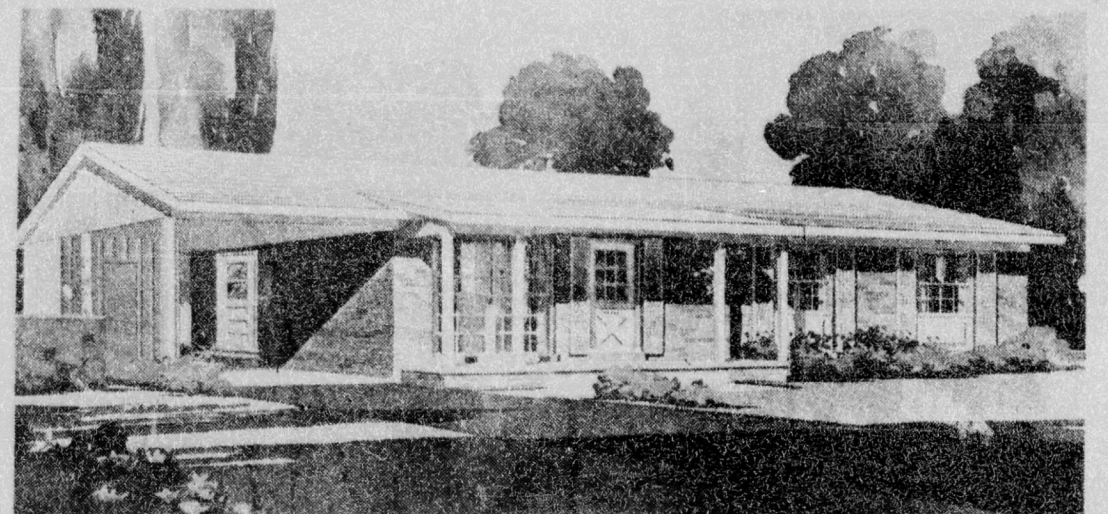

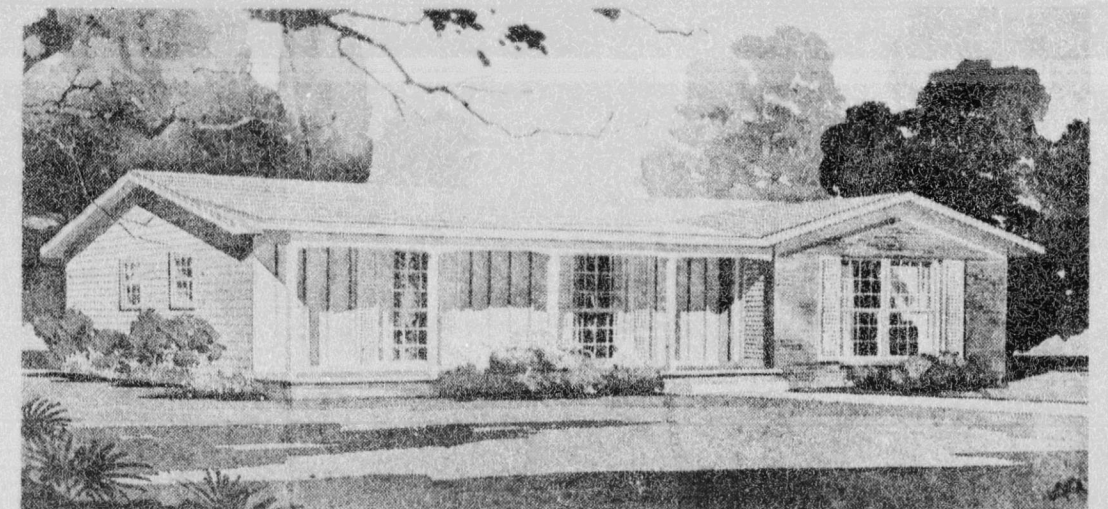
